Celts in Eastern Europe, circa 2nd century BC. AR Tetradrachm (Silver, 22.5 mm, 7.56 g.). "Sattelkopfpferd" Type, after types of Philip II of Macedon. Celticised, bearded head of Zeus to right. Rev. Stylized horse to left. Göbl, OTA, pl. 26, 300/12-14, Lanz 644; Kent & Mays, BMC I, pl. 3, no. 45. Small crack of flan. Lightly toned. Near extremely fine.

Upright anchor; in field, crayfish to left and A to right. SNG BM Black Sea 157; SNG Bulgaria Russe 2, 120-168; HGC 3.2, 1323. Deeply toned. Good very fine.



11 Thrace. Apollonia Pontika, circa 480-470 BC. AR Drachm (Silver, 13 mm, 3.27 g.). Facing Archaic Gorgoneion with tongue protruding, serpents around. Rev. An attractive and horrifying Archaic image of the Gorgon Medousa!

18 Thrace. Thasos, circa 168-140 BC. AR Tetradrachm (Silver, 31.5 mm, 16.24 g.). Wreathed head of young Dionysos to right. Rev. HPAKΛΕΟΥΣ / Σ ΩTHPOΣ / ΘΑΣΙΩΝ, Herakles standing facing, head left, holding club, lion skin draped over left arm; M to inner left. Dewing 1338; SNG Lockett 1240; Prokopov, Silberprägung, Group VI; HGC 6, 359. Lightly toned with nice iridescent hues. Struck with a slightly worn reverse die. Good very fine. Rare early original issue of the late Thasian tetradrachms of a remarkably florid style!



19 Thrace. Thasos, circa 120-75 BC. AR Tetradrachm (Silver, 32 mm, 16.48 g.). Wreathed head of young Dionysos to right. Rev. HPAKΛΕΟVΣ / $\Sigma\Omega$ THPOΣ / ΘΑΣΙ Ω N, Herakles standing facing, head left, holding club, lion skin draped over left arm; monogram MH to inner left. Le Rider, Thasos, 52; Prokopov, Silberprägung, Group XIX; HGC 6, 359. Some scuffs and hits along the edges. Reverse, slight die shift. Lightly toned. Good very fine.



20 Thrace. Thasos, circa 120-75 BC. AR Tetradrachm (Silver, 31.4 mm, 16.09 g.). Wreathed head of young Dionysos to right. Rev. Macedon. Eion, circa 480-470 BC. AR Trihemiobol (Silver, 11 mm, 0.94 g.). Goose standing to right, head turned to left. Rev. Incuse quadripartite square. Rosen 95; SNG ANS 272; HGC 3.1, 519. Toned. Very fine.



23 Thraco-Macedonian Tribes. The Mygdones or Krestones, circa 480-470 BC. AR Diobol or 1/8 Stater (Silver, 12.6 mm, 0.90 g). Goat kneeling right, head turned back to left, around two pellets; below short horizontal line. Rev. Quadripartite incuse square. Rosen 89; SNG ANS 60 ("Akanthos"); HGC 3.1, 368 ("Aigai"); Lorber, Goats, Issue 15. Very fine.



Macedon, kings. Time of Philip III Arrhidaios – Kassander, 323/2-315 BC. AR 1/5 Tetradrachm (Silver, 13.7 mm, 2.56 g). Struck in the name and types of Philip II of Macedon, Amphipolis mint. Head of Apollo to right, wearing tainia. Rev. ΦΙΛΙΠΠΟΥ, horseman riding to right; below, monogram AN. Le Rider pl. 52, 4-5. SNG ANS 583. Deeply toned. Good very fine. With a fine classical portrait of Apollo.



25 Macedon, kings. Philip II of Macedon, 356-336 BC. AE (Bronze, 18.7 mm, 6.40 g.). Uncertain mint in Macedonia. Diademed head of Apollo to right. Rev. ΦΙΛΙΠΠΟΥ, youth on horseback to right; below – uncertain letter. SNG ANS 894; HGC 3.1, 882. Natural green patina, about good very fine with a fine classical portrait of Apollo.


