



Tiberius appears in it, but as a military tribune. It seems that he acted in the Cantabrian wars and that he was the patron of several cities such as Ulia, Italica and Cartago Nova. In this mintage, as it had not yet been adopted by Augustus, it appears with the legend TI NERO instead of TI CAESAR.
