ΒΑΣΙΛΕΩΣ vertical to right, ΑΝΤΙΓΟΝΟΥ vertical to left, Athena Alkidemos walking left, wearing crested helmet, aegis and clamys, holding shield decorated with gorgoneion and brandishing thunderbolt, crested helmet at her feet to left, monogram to right.

ΑΛΕΞΑΝΔΡΟΥ vertical to right, Zeus Aetophoros seated left on throne, holding eagle and scepter, oinochoe beneath vine-tendrils to left below two monograms.

Draped bust right, wearing five-pointed tiara decorated with star between two opposite eagles, heads turned each-other facing. Rev. ΒΑΣΙΛΕΩΣ vertical to right, ΤΙΓΡΑΝΟΥ vertical to left, Tyche turreted, veiled and draped seated right on rocks, holding palm branch, the river-god Araxes swimming below to right, monogram on rock, all within wreath.

**34** Kings of Armenia. Tigranes II the Great, 95-56 BC. AR Tetradrachm (30.00 mm, 15.33 g). Tigranocerta mint, struck circa 80-68 BC. Obv. Draped bust right, wearing five-pointed tiara decorated with star between two opposite eagles, heads turned each-other facing. Rev. ΒΑΣΙΛΕΩΣ vertical to right, ΤΙΓΡΑΝΟΥ vertical to left, Tyche turreted, veiled and draped seated right on rocks, holding palm branch, Φ to inner right, the river-god Araxes swimming below to right, monogram on rock, all within wreath.

**35** Phoenicia. Tyre. 'Uzzimilk. Circa 347-332 BC. AR Shekel (19.00 mm, 8.43 g). Dated RY 10 (= 341/0 BC). Obv. Melqart half-length to right, riding hippocamp galloping right, holding reins in the right hand and bow in outstretched left hand, over double line of waves, dolphin swimming right below. Rev. Owl standing right, crook and flail behind, date to right.

**36** Seleukid Kings. Antiochos I Soter, 281-261 BC. AU Stater (16.00 mm, 8.42 g). Al-Khanoum mint, struck circa 266-261 BC. Obv. Diademed head right. Rev. ΒΑΣΙΛΕΩΣ vertical to right, [ANTIOXOY] vertical to left (out of flan), Apollo Delphios seated left on omphalos, holding grounded bow and arrow, [Δ] to upper left (out of flan). Extremely rare.

ΣΩΤΗΡΟΣ vertical to right, ANT-IOXOY vertical to left, Apollo Delphios seated left on omphalos, holding grounded bow and arrow. Rare.

ΒΑΣΙΛΕΩΣ vertical to right, ΛΥΣΙΜΑΧΟΥ vertical to left, Athena Nikephoros seated left on throne, wearing long crested helmet, holding Nike to left, crowning the king's name, resting the left elbow on grounded shield decorated with lion's head, transversal spear behind, monogram to inner left above knee. Broken flan.

**39** Ptolemaic Kingdom. Ptolemy II Philadelphos, 285-246 BC. AR Tetradrachm (27.00 mm, 12.71 g). Sidon mint, struck circa 274 BC. Obv. Diademed head right. Rev. [ΒΑΣΙΛΕΩΣ] to right (out of flan), ΠΤΟΛΕΜΑΙΟΥ to left, eagle standing left on thunderbolt with closed wings, ΣΙ to left.

Diademed bust right, wearing aegis. Rev. ΒΑΣΙΛΕΩΣ to right, ΠΤΟΛΕΜΑΙΟΥ to left, eagle standing left on thunderbolt with closed wings, ΛΓ (date) to left, ΣΑ to right.

**41** Ptolemaic Kingdom. Ptolemy VI Philometor, 180-145 BC. AR Tetradrachm (27.00 mm, 13.00 g). Alexandria mint, struck circa 169-145 BC. Obv. Diademed head right, wearing aegis around neck. Rev. ΒΑΣΙΛΕΩΣ to right, ΠΤΟΛΕΜΑΙΟΥ to left, eagle standing left on thunderbolt with closed wings, no control marks.

[ΔΗΜΤΡΙΟΥ] vertical to right, ΒΑ-ΣΙΛΕΩ-Σ below, Poseidon Pelagaios nude except for the clamys hanging from the left outstretched arm, advancing left from behind, brandishing trident, monogram to left and right.

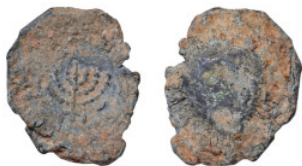
