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1 EASTERN EUROPE. Imitations of Philip II of Macedon. 3rd-2nd centuries BC. AR Drachm (16 mm, 1.99 g.). Kugelwange type. Struck by the Skordoski in Syrmia. Laureate head of Zeus right / Horse advancing left; pellet-in-annulet above.

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2 ATTICA, Athens. Circa 454-404 BC. AR Hemiobol (7vmm, 0.34 g.). Helmeted head of Athena right / Owl standing right, head facing; olive spray behind; all within incuse square.

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3 KINGS of BITHYNIA. Prousius II Kynegos. 182-149 BC. Æ (17 mm, 3.56g.). Head of Prousius right, wearing winged diadem / Herakles standing left, holding grounded club and lion's skin; monogram to inner right.

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4 BOEOTIA, Federal Coinage. Circa 395-387 BC. AR Stater (23 mm, 11.26 g). Boeotian shield / Amphora; BO-IQ across field, grape bunch above; all within incuse concave circle.

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5 CIMMERIAN BOSPOROS, Pantikapaion. Circa 250-200 BC. Æ (18 mm, 2.44 g.). Wreathed head of Pan left / Bow and arrow.

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6 BRUTTIUM, Lokroi Epizephyrioi. Circa 304-289 BC or 280-275 BC. Æ (23 mm, 9.73 g.). Head of Athena to left, wearing Corinthian helmet; behind, grain ear / ΛΟΚΡΩΝ Pegasus flying to left; below forelegs.

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7 BRUTTIUM, Rhegion. Circa 215-211 BC. Æ Pentonkion (25 mm, 9.34 g.). Second Punic War issue. Janiform head / Asklepios seated left, holding scepter; to left, Π (mark of value).

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8 CALABRIA, Brundisium. 2nd century BC. Æ Semis (21 mm, 8.56 g.). Semuncial standard. Wreathed head of Neptune right; to left, Victory, crowning him with wreath, S (mark of value) below / Phalanthos, holding Victory who crowns him with wreath and lyre, astride dolphin left; star to left, S (mark of value) to right.

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9 KINGS of CAPPADOCIA, Ariarathes V Eusebes Philopator. Circa 163-130 BC. AR Drachm (17 mm, 3.98 g.). Mint A (Eusebeia-Mazaca). Dated CY 33 (130 BC). Diademed head right / Athena standing left, holding Nike, spear, and shield; T to outer left, monogram to inner left, X to outer right, ΓΛ (date) in exergue.

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10 KINGS of CAPPADOCIA, Ariarathes V Eusebes Philopator. Circa 163-130 BC. AR Drachm (17 mm, 3.98 g.). Mint A (Eusebeia-Mazaca). Dated CY 33 (130 BC). Diademed head right / Athena standing left, holding Nike, spear, and shield; monogram to outer left, monogram to inner left, X to outer right, ΓΛ (date) in exergue.

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11 KINGS OF CAPPADOCIA, Ariarathes VI Epiphanes Philopator, circa 130-112/0 BC. AR Drachm (18 mm, 4.07 g.). Diademed head right of Ariarathes to right / ΒΑΣΙΛΕΩΣ ΑΡΙΑΡΑΘΟΥ ΕΠΙΦΑΝΟΥΣ Athena Nikephoros standing left; to inner left, T outer right LI or B.

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12 KINGS of CAPPADOCIA, Ariarathes IX Eusebes Philopator. Circa 100-85 BC. AR Drachm (19 mm, 3.97 g.). Mint A (Eusebeia-Mazaka). Dated RY 5 (96/5 BC). Diademed head right, with Mithradatic style portrait / Athena Nikephoros standing left; monogram to inner left, E (date) in exergue.

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13 KINGS OF CAPPADOCIA, Ariobarzanes I Philoromaioi, 96-63 BC. AR Drachm (18 mm, 4.06 g.). Diademed head of Ariobarzanes I to right / BAΣΙΛΕΩΣ ΑΡΙΟΒΑΡΖΑΝΟΥ ΦΙΛΟΡΩΜΑΙΟΥ Athena standing front, head to left, holding Nike in her right hand and shield in her left, while cradling spear in crook of her left arm; in field to left, AP; in exergue, Ις (date).

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14 KINGS of CAPPADOCIA, Ariobarzanes I Philoromaioi. 96-63 BC. AR Drachm (18 mm, 3.93 g.). Mint A (Eusebeia). Dated RY 31 (65/4 BC). Diademed head right / Athena standing left, holding Nike and spear, hand resting on shield at her side; monogram to inner left, AA (date) in exergue.

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15 KINGS of CAPPADOCIA, Ariobarzanes III Eusebes Philoromaioi. 52-42 BC. AR Drachm (17 mm, 3.79 g.). Mint A (Eusebeia under Mt. Argaios). Diademed head right / Athena standing left, holding Nike, spear, and shield; star and crescent to left, monogram to right.

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16 CARIA, Knidos. Circa 250-210 BC. AR Half Siglos (15mm, 2.29 g.). Epion, magistrate. Head of Artemis right, quiver to left / Tripod.

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17 CORINTHIA, Corinth. Circa 350/45-285 BC. AR Stater (24 mm, 6.99 g.). Pegasus flying left / Helmeted head of Athena left; N. Ravel Period V, 1065; Pegasi 383; BCD Corinth 126; HGC 4, 1848. Harshly cleaned with weak strike and scratches.

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18 ILLYRIA. Dyrrhachium. Circa 3rd-1st centuries BC. AR drachm (18 mm, 2.74 g.). Maxatas and Eortaius, magistrates. MAXATAΣ, cow standing right, suckling calf standing left below; club in exergue / ΔΥΡ-ΕΟΡ-ΤΑΙ-ΟΥ, double stellate pattern.

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19 PTOLEMAIC KINGS of EGYPT, Ptolemy VI Philometor. Second sole reign, 163-145 BC. Æ (28 mm, 17.75 g.). Alexandria mint. Series 7B. Head of Isis right, wearing wreath of grain ears, and her hair in long curls / Eagle, with open wings, standing left on thunderbolt; monogram to left.

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20 IONIA, Ephesos. Circa 180-67 BC. AR Tetradrachm (27 mm, 12.38 g.). Cistophoric standard. Dated CY 66 (69/8 BC). Cista mystica within ivy wreath / Two serpents entwined around bow and bow case; above, palm frond between crossed cornucopias; to left, Ξς (date) above ethnic; long torch to right.

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21 IONIA, Ephesos. Circa 370-350 BC. Æ (12 mm, 1.78 g.). Bee / Forepart of a stag right, head left.

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22 IONIA, Miletos. Late 6th-early 5th century BC. AR Hemihekte – Obol (10 mm, 1.09 g.). Forepart of lion right, head reverted / Stellate pattern within incuse square with one side contoured in the shape of an M.

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23 IONIA, Miletos. Late 6th-early 5th century BC. AR Hemihekte – Obol (10 mm, 1.24 g.). Forepart of lion right, head reverted / Stellate pattern within incuse square with one side contoured in the shape of an M.

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24 IONIA, Miletos. Late 6th-early 5th century BC. AR Hemihekte – Obol (10 mm, 1.17 g.). Forepart of lion right, head reverted / Stellate pattern within incuse square with one side contoured in the shape of an M.

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25 IONIA, Phokaia . Circa 350-300 BC. Æ (20 mm, 3.58 g.). Head of Hermes left wearing petasos / Forepart of a griffin left.

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26 LUCANIA, Metapontion. Circa 225-200 BC. Æ (16 mm, 4.89 g.). Helmeted head of Leukippos right / Demeter standing facing, head right, holding long cross-torch.

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27 LYCAONIA, Laranda. Circa 324/3 BC. AR Hemiobol (9 mm, 0.59 g.). Head of male right / Forepart of hound right; crescent to left.

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28 LYDIA, Sardes. Circa 133 BC- AD 14. Æ (21 mm, 7.98 g.) Ptolemy, son of Kerases, magistrate. Draped bust of Artemis right, with bow and quiver over shoulder / ΣΑΡΔΙΑΝΩΝ / ΠΤΟΛΕΜΑΙΟΣ ΚΕΡΑΣΕΙΣ, Athena standing left, holding crowning Nike and spear, and resting hand upon shield.

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29 MACEDON, Tragilos. Circa 400 BC. Æ (14 mm, 3.54 g.). Head of Hermes right, wearing petasos / Rose; grain ear(?) to right.

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30 KINGS of MACEDON. Amyntas III. 394/3-370/69 BC. Æ Tetrachalkon (16 mm, 3.38 g.). Aigai or Pella mint. Head of Herakles right, wearing lion skin / Eagle standing right, devouring serpent.

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31 KINGS of MACEDON. Philip II 359-336 BC. Æ (17 mm, 6.90 g.). Uncertain mint in Macedon, Diademed male head to left / Youth on horseback to right; ΦΙΛΙΠΠΟΥ above, spearhead below.

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32 KINGS of MACEDON. Alexander III 'the Great'. 336-323 BC. Æ Half Unit (16 mm, 3.73 g.). Uncertain mint in Macedon. Male head right, wearing tainia / Horse prancing right; kantharos below.

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33 KINGS of MACEDON. Philip III Arrhidaios. 323-317 BC. AR Drachm (17 mm, 4.27 g.). In the types of Alexander III. Magnesia mint. Struck under Menander or Kleitos, circa 323-319 BC. Head of Herakles right, wearing lion skin / Zeus Aëtrophoros seated left; monogram below throne. Price P57

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34 PHOENICIA, Arados. Circa 380-351/0 BC. AR Obol (9 mm, 0.81 g.). Laureate head of Ba'al-Arwad to right / [] ('ma' in Aramaic) Galley right over waves.

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35 PHOENICIA, Sidon. Autonomous issues. 1st century BC. Æ (20 mm, 7.16 g.). Dated CY 21 (91/0 BC). Turreted and veiled head of Tyche right / Astarte, holding tiller and stylis, standing left on galley left; LBA (date) to right.

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36 PONTOS, Amaseia. Circa 110-100 BC. Æ (16 mm, 4.21 g.). Time of Mithradates VI Eupator. Winged bust of Perseus right / Cornucopia flanked by caps of the Dioskouroi.

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37 SELEUKID EMPIRE. Antiochos III 'the Great'. 222-187 BC. Æ (11 mm, 1.38 g.). Sardes mint. Laureate head of Apollo right / Elephant standing left.

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38 SELEUKID EMPIRE. Antiochos IV Epiphanes. 175-164 BC. Æ (15 mm, 2.73 g.). Ptolemaïs (Ake) mint. Veiled and diademed bust right of Laodike IV; monogram to left / Horned elephant's head left; M above elephant's trunk; below, prow left.

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39 SELEUKID EMPIRE. Antiochos VI Dionysos. 144-142 BC. Serrate Æ (22 mm, 7.92 g.). Antioch mint. Radiate head right, crowned with ivy / Elephant advancing left; cornucopia to right.

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40 SELEUKID EMPIRE. Tryphon. Circa 142-138 BC. Æ (17 mm, 5.20 g.). Antioch on the Orontes mint. Diademed head right / Macedonian helmet with ibex horn left; caps of the Dioskouroi to inner left.

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41 SELEUKID EMPIRE. Antiochos VII Euergetes (Sidetes). 138-129 BC. AR Tetradrachm (26 mm, 12.42 g.). Tyre mint. Diademed and draped bust right / ΒΑΣΙΛΕΩΣ ANTIOXOY, eagle standing left on prow left; palm frond in background; to left, monogram above club surmounted by Tyre monogram; to right, monogram above date; monogram between legs. Retoned.

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42 SELEUKID EMPIRE. Antiochos VII Euergetes (Sidetes). 138-129 BC. Æ (16 mm, 3.51 g.). Ptolemaïs (Ake) mint. Helmeted and draped bust of Athena right / Owl standing slightly right, head facing; H to outer right.

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43 SELEUKID EMPIRE. Antiochos VIII Epiphanes (Grypos). 121/0-97/6 BC. Æ (16 mm, 5.33 g.). Antioch on the Orontes mint. Radiate head right / Eagle standing left, scepter over shoulder

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44 SELEUKID EMPIRE. Kleopatra Thea & Antiochos VIII. 125-121 BC. Æ (20 mm, 5.94 g.). Antioch on the Orontes mint. Radiate head of Antiochos VIII right / Owl standing right, head facing, on amphora

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45 SELEUKID EMPIRE. Antiochos X Eusebes Philopator. Circa 94-88 BC. Æ (17 mm, 5.55 g.). Antioch on the Orontes mint. Diademed head right / Piloï of the Dioskouroi surmounted by stars; monogram to outer left.

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46 SICILY, Akragas. Circa 415-406 BC. Æ Hemilitron – Hexonkion (28 mm, 20.53 g.). Eagle standing right, head raised, wings spread, on fish / Crab holding serpent in claw; conch shell and octopus below; six pellets (mark of value) around. Small divot below eagle and aggressively cleaned.

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47 SICILY, Akragas. Circa 400-380 BC. Æ Hemilitron (25 mm, 18.00 g.). Horned head of young river god Akragas left, wearing tainia / Eagle standing left, head right, on Ionic capital; crab to left, six pellets (mark of value) to right.

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48 SICILY. Akragas. Punic occupation, circa 405-392 BC. Æ Hemilitron (26 mm, 13.10 g.). Eagle / Crab. Countermark: head of Herakles or head of river god within round incuse.

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49 SICILY, Messana. 470-466 BC. AR Tetradrachm (26 mm, 16.85 g.). Charioteer, seated, driving biga of mules right; olive leaf in exergue / Hare springing right.

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50 SICILY, Syracuse. Second Democracy. 466-405 BC. Æ (15 mm, 3.81 g.). Head of Arethousa left, hair in sphendone / Wheel of four spokes; dolphins in lower quarters.

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51 SICILY, Syracuse. Dionysios I. 405-367 BC. Æ (20 mm, 8.61 g.). Head of Athena left, wearing Corinthian helmet with neck guard / Hippocamp left.

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52 SICILY, Syracuse. Dionysios I. 405-367 BC. Æ(20 mm, 5.70 g.). Head of Athena left, wearing Corinthian helmet with neck guard / Hippocamp left.

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53 SICILY, Syracuse. Agathokles. 317-289 BC. Æ (21 mm, 5.34 g.). Struck circa 304-289 BC. Draped bust of Artemis Soteira right, quiver over shoulder / Winged thunderbolt. Repatinated.

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54 SICILY, Syracuse. Hieron II. 275-215 BC. Æ (20 mm, 4.67 g.). Struck circa 275-269 BC. Head of Persephone left, wearing wreath of grain ears / Bull charging left; club and AI above, IE in exergue.

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55 SICILY, Syracuse. Hieron II. 275-215 BC. Æ (22 mm, 8.09 g.). Diademed head of Poseidon left / Ornamented trident; flanked by dolphins downward.

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56 SICILY, Syracuse. Hiketas II. 287-278 BC. Æ (18 mm, 6.82 g.). Struck circa 287-283 BC. Wreathed head of Kore left; grain ear to right / Nike driving galloping biga right.

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57 SICILY, Syracuse. Hiketas II. 287-278 BC. Æ (23 mm, 6.20 g.). Laureate head of Zeus Hellanios right / Eagle standing left on thunderbolt.

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58 SKYTHIA, Olbia. Circa 320-315 BC. Æ (12 mm, 1.33 g.). Wreathed head of Demeter left / Sea eagle right standing on dolphin right.

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59 SKYTHIA, Olbia. Circa 320-315 BC. Æ (14 mm, 2.32 g.). Wreathed head of Demeter left / Sea eagle right standing on dolphin right.

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60 THESSALY, Larissa. 3rd century BC. Æ Tetrachalkon (20 mm, 5.42 g.). Wreathed head of the nymph Larissa facing slightly left / Warrior, holding couched lance, on horse charging right.

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61 THESSALY, Larissa. Mid-late 4th century BC. Æ Dichalkon (18 mm, 2.60 g.). Head of the nymph Larissa right / Horse standing right, preparing to lie down.

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62 THESSALY, Larissa. Mid-late 4th century BC. Æ Dichalkon (18 mm, 3.63 g.). Head of the nymph Larissa right / Horse standing left, grazing.

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67 THRACE, Abdera. Circa 300-250 BC. Æ Hemiobol (18 mm, 3.42 g.). Hermostratos, magistrate. Griffin with pointed wings rearing left / Laureate head of Apollo right within linear frame; ΕΠΙ ΕΡΜΟ-ΣΤΡΑΤΟΥ around. Repatinated.

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68 THRACE, Chersonesos. Circa 386-338 BC. AR Hemidrachm (14 mm, 2.26 g.). Forepart of lion right, head left / Quadripartite incuse square with alternating raised and sunken quarters; pellet and ΑΓ monogram in one sunken quarter, amphora in opposite quarter.

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69 THRACE, Maroneia. 1st century BC. Æ (20 mm, 6.07 g.). Wreathed head of young Dionysos right / Dionysos standing half-left, holding grapes and narthex stalk.

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70 SICILY, Syracuse. Dionysios II. 367-357 BC. Æ Tetras(?) (23 mm, 10.75 g.). Griffin springing left; clouds below / Horse prancing left, trailing rein.

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71 THESSALY, Phalanna. Mid 4th century BC. Æ Trichalkon (19 mm, 7.20 g.). Male head right / Head of nymph right, wearing sakkos.

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72 TROAS, Abydos. 4th century BC. Æ (12 mm, .98 g.). Laureate head of Apollo right / Eagle standing left; amphora to left.

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73 TROAS, Kebren. Circa 387-310 BC. Æ (11 mm, .98 g.). Laureate head of Apollo right / Head of ram right.

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74 KINGS of PARTHIA. Gotarzes II. Circa AD 40-51. AR Drachm (19 mm, 3.55 g.). Ekbatana mint. Diademed bust left, wearing long beard, earring, and spiral torque; all within pelleted border

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75 KINGS of PARTHIA. Pakoros I. Circa AD 78-120. AR Drachm (20 mm, 3.70 g.). Ekbatana mint. Diademed bust left, wearing medium-length beard / Archer (Arsakes I) seated right on throne, holding bow; monogram below bow.

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76 KINGS of PARTHIA. Vologases IV. Circa AD 147-191. AR Drachm (20 mm, 3.45 g.). Ekbatana mint. Diademed bust left, wearing tiara / Archer (Arsakes I) seated right on thrones, holding bow; monogram below bow.

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77 KINGS of PARTHIA. Osroes II. Circa AD 190. AR Drachm (21 mm, 3.32 g.). Ekbatana mint. Diademed bust left, wearing tiara / Archer (Arsakes I) seated right on throne, holding bow with pellet above; monogram below bow; uncertain Parthian legend

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78 KINGS of ELYMAIS. Orodes II. Early-mid 2nd century AD. Æ Drachm (14 mm, 3.81 g.). Draped bust facing slightly left, wearing tiara; to right, star-in-crescent above inverted anchor with two crossbars at top and bottom / Field of regular, parallel dashes.

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79 KINGS of ELYMAIS. Orodes II. Early-mid 2nd century AD. Æ Drachm (15 mm, 3.67 g.). Draped bust facing slightly left, wearing tiara; to right, star-in-crescent above inverted anchor with two crossbars / Radiate bust of Belos facing slightly right.

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80 INDO-GREEK, Bactria. Antimachos II, Circa 160-155 BC, AR drachm (16 mm, 2.36 g.). Nike advancing left, holding palm branch and fillet / Horseman prancing right

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81 INDO-SKYTHIANS. Azes. Circa 58-12 BC. AR Drachm (18 mm, 2.33 g.). Zeus standing left, holding torque and scepter / Nike standing right, holding wreath with angled fillets and palm frond with long flowing fillets; monogram to inner right.

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82 BAKTRIA. Antimachos II, Circa 160-155 BC, AR drachm (16 mm, 2.45 g.). Nike advancing left, holding palm branch and fillet / Horseman prancing right

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83 BAKTRIA. Eukratides I Megasthenes. Circa 170-145 BC. AE Quadruple Unit (22 x 20 mm, 6.48 g.). Square module. Diademed and draped bust right, wearing crested helmet adorned with bull's horn and ear / The Dioskouroi on horses rearing right, holding palms and spears; monogram to inner right.

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84 BAKTRIA. Menander I Soter. Circa 155-130 BC. AR Drachm (17 mm, 2.41 g.). Diademed heroic bust left, seen from behind, wearing aegis and brandishing spear / Athena Alkidemos standing right, holding shield and thunderbolt; monogram to left.

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85 BAKTRIA. Menander I Soter. Circa 155-130 BC. AR Drachm (18 mm, 2.42 g.). Diademed and draped bust right / Athena Alkidemos standing left; monogram to right.

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86 BAKTRIA. Menander I Soter. Circa 155-130 BC. AR Drachm (16 mm, 2.47 g.). Diademed, draped, and cuirassed bust right, wearing crested helmet covered with pelt of scales and adorned with head of Gorgon and wing / Athena Alkidemos advancing left; monogram to right.

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87 BAKTRIA. Antialcidas. Circa 115-95 BC or 130-120 BC. AR Drachm (16 mm, 2.40 g.). Bust of king wearing diadem and kausia / Zeus enthroned left, holding Nike. Elephant to left raising its head and trunk; monogram behind.

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88 INDIA, Kushan Empire. Kipunada. Circa AD 335-350 or 350-375. Pale AV Dinar (18 mm, 7.71 g.). Kipunada standing facing, head left, sacrificing over altar and holding standard; filleted trident to upper left, Brahmi "da" to lower left, "bacharnatha" to inner right, "kipanada" to outer right / Ardoxsho enthroned facing, holding filleted garland and cornucopia; tamgha in upper left field.

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89 CARTHAGE, Second Punic War. Circa 205-203 BC. BI Dishekel (26 mm, 11.52 g.). Carthage mint. Wreathed head of Tanit left / Horse standing right; palm tree in background.

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90 CARTHAGE, First Punic War. Circa 264-241 BC. Æ Trishekel (30 mm, 18.39 g.). Carthage mint. Wreathed head of Tanit left; linear border / Horse standing right; palm tree in background; linear border.

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91 Rare unstruck flan. Æ (14 mm, 5.03 g.)

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92 MYSIA, Miletopolis. Caracalla AD 198-217. Æ Tetrassarion (32 mm, 19.10 g.), Pomponios Onesimos, strategos for the second time. ΑΥΤ Κ Μ ΑΥΡ CEH ANTΩNEINOC Laureate, draped and cuirassed bust of Caracalla to right, seen from behind / ΕΠΙ CΤΡΑ ΠΟΜΠΩΝΙΟΥ ΟΝΗCΙΜΟΥ / ΤΟ - Β / ΜΕΙΛΗΤΟΠΟΛΕΙΤΩΝ Hermes seated left on rock, holding kerykeion in his right hand and leaning left on rock.

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93 MYSIA, Parium. Elagabalus AD 218-222. Æ Hemiassarion (18 mm, 3.89 g.). ANTONINVS PIVS FEL A Laureate, draped and cuirassed bust of Elagabalus to right, seen from behind / C G I H PA Diana Lucifera advancing right, holding torch in each hand.

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94 LYDIA, Sala. Elagabalus AD 218-222. Æ Tetrassarion (26 mm, 12.11 g.), Diophantes, archon. ΑΥΤ Κ Μ ΑΥΡ ANTΩNEINOC Laureate and cuirassed bust of Elagabalus right, wearing cuirass decorated with Gorgoneion / ΕΠΙ ΔΙΟΦΑΝΤΟΥ CΑΛΗΝΩΝ Zeus Lydios standing facing, head to left, holding eagle on his right hand and long scepter on his left . RPC VI online 4560.9 (this coin).

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95 MYSIA, Lampsacus. Elagabalus. AD 218-222. Æ Assarion (20 mm, 3.85 g.), Severus, strategos. ΑΥΤ Κ Μ ANTΩNEINOC Laureate, draped and cuirassed bust of Elagabalus to right, seen from behind. Rev. ΕΠΙ CΤΡ[A] CΕΒΗΡΟΥ ΛΑΜ-ΨΑΚΗΝΩΝ Homonoia standing front, head to left, holding patera in her right hand and cornucopiae in her left. From the Jay Smith Collection of coins of Elagabalus. Small spot of corrosion removed on reverse and repatinated.

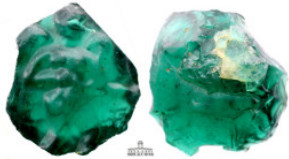

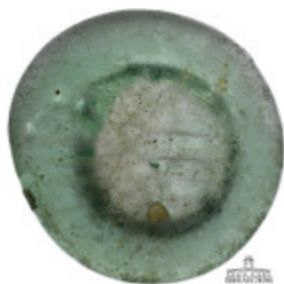

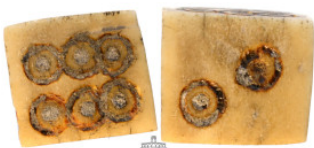
