Toned in the deep areas, some areas of flatness, otherwise, good very fine.

Rider on horseback to left. Cf. Göbl, OTA pl. 12, 122/2; POK pl. 6, 122; Lanz 412. Fourèe and as a such very well preserved anly a minor spot (over the horse) where the silver is missing, otherwise an attractive and clear specimen.

4 South Danube Celtic Tribe, Silver Drachm (14 mm, 2.54 g.). Eingesetzter Pferdefuß Type. Circa 3rd Century BC. Celticised, laureate and bearded head to right. Rev. Rider on horseback to left. Cf. Göbl, OTA pl. 12, 122/2; POK pl. 6, 122; Lanz 412. References are valid for the tetradrachm of this type. Very rare as a Drachm, and one of a few known- see Auktionshaus H. D. Rauch GmbH, Auction 82. Very fine.



5 Celts in Eastern Europe, circa 2nd - 1st century BC. Silver Drachm (13.85 mm, 2.03 g.). 'Kapostaler Kleingeld' Type. Celticised, laureate and bearded head of Zeus to right. All within border of dots. Rev. Stylised rider wearing helmet with long crest on horseback to left. Göbl, OTA pl. 39, 503/1-3 var.; Lanz 821-22. About Good Very fine.



Celts in Eastern Europe, circa 3rd - 2nd century BC. Silver Drachm (19.5 mm, 2.77 g.). Philip III Type. Celticised head of Herakles to right, wearing lion skin headdress. Border of dots. Rev. Stylised Zeus Aëtophoros seated to left, holding sceptre; remains of a legend to right - ΛΙΛ, monogram to left, inverted H under throne. BMC Celtic I, pl. 12, 200; Göbl, OTA pl. 45, 591/1 var.; Lanz 934-935. Lightly toned. Good very fine.



7 Imitative series, Island off Thasos, late 2nd-1st Century BC. AR Tetradrachm (30,5 mm, 16.50 g.). Stylized head of youthful Dionysos to right, wearing ivy wreath. Rev. HPAK Λ EOY Σ Σ QTHPO Σ Θ A Σ I Ω N Stylized Herakles standing facing, head to left, resting his right hand on grounded club and carrying lion skin over his left arm. Lanz 971-4. OTA ppl. 46-7, Class III. Typically for the type slightly bent flan, otherwise, about extremely fine with a lovely old cabinet tone nicely contrasting with the yellowish hues from the minting.



8 Hieron II, 275-215 BC. Bronze Tetras (19,70 mm, 7.37 g.). Syracuse, 263-218 BC. Diademed head of Poseidon left. Rev. Ornamented trident; flanked by dolphins downward. HGC 2, 1550. Obverse struck slightly off center, otherwise, about good very fine with a lovely brownish patina.



9 Lucania, Poseidonia. Circa 445-420 BC. Silver Nomos (18 mm, 8.11 g.). Poseidon, nude but for chlamys draped over both arms, holding trident aloft, advancing right; all within dotted circular border between concentric linear borders / Bull standing left within incuse circle. HN Italy 1116; SNG ANS 655. Nice very fine with a nice old cabined tone. Attractive specimen with a clear, defined profile portrait of Poseidon.

10 Moesia, Istros. Circa 400-350 BC. Silver Diobol (10,77 mm, 1.17 g.). Two facing male heads side by side, one upright and the other inverted - a tête-bêche pair. Rev. IΣΤΡΙΗ Sea eagle standing left on dolphin; below, ΦA. AMNG I 429. Cf. SNG BM Black Sea 234. About good very fine.
