These celestial elements seem to refer to the mythological tradition that Gaia, the mother of the giants, attempted to save them by seeking out a magic herb that would make them invulnerable, but Jupiter forbade the sun and moon to shine and the dawn to break until he had harvested all of the herb himself. In this case, the star on this coin must represent Venus, the morning star. This unusual reverse type has sometimes been interpreted as an allegory for the victory of L. Cornelius Scipio—a famous ancestor of the moneyer Cn. Cornelius Sisena—over the Seleucid king Antiochus III at the Battle of Magnesia in 190 BC. In this interpretation, Scipio is represented by Jupiter and the defeated king by the anguipede giant.




