10 BOEOTIA. Orchomenos. Circa 370-364 BC. (bronze, 2.20 g, 12 mm). Boeotian shield. Rev. E-P-K-O arranged withing the rays of a star. BCD Boiotia 225; HGC 4, 1260; SNG Copenhagen 206-7. Nearly very fine.



CRETE. Kydonia. 2nd-1st century BC. Ae (bronze, 2.39 g, 14 mm). Owl standing right, head facing. Rev. Upward-facing crescent; star above; KY below. SNG Copenhagen 421-3. Very fine. Very rare.



12 IONIA. Ephesos. Circa 1st century AD. Ae Tessera (bronze, 2.94 g, 19 mm). ΠΡΟC ΠΑΛΥΡΙΝ ΚΗΡΙΛΙΟ WΔΕ Bee. Rev. E - Φ / CKWΠΙ Stag crouching left, head right. SNG Aulock 1875; SNG Copenhagen 355. Good fine.



13 ISLANDS OFF IONIA. Samos. Circa 510-500 BC. Drachm (silver, 3.10 g, 15 mm). Forepart of a winged boar to right. Rev. Facing lion's scalp; all within dotted square within incuse square. Test cut, nearly very fine.



14 ISLANDS OFF ATTICA. Aegina. Circa 5th/4th century BC. Stater (silver, 12.06 g, 17 mm). Sea turtle, head in profile (?), shell with line of pellets down center. Rev. Large square incuse with skew pattern. Good fine.



CYPRUS. Salamis. Euelthon, circa 530/15-480. Stater (silver, 10.90 g, 22 mm). Ram recumbent left. Rev. Blank. Cf. SNG Copenhagen 31. Very fine.



16 BRUTTIUM. Rhegion. Second Punic War, circa 211-201 BC. Tetrachalkon (bronze, 3.20 g, 15 mm). Jugate heads of the Dioskouroi right, wearing piloi and laurel wreaths; spear-head behind. Rev. Asklepios standing left, holding branch and sceptre; bird on left arm; (mark of value) to left. Good fine.



17 PHRYGIA. Apameia. Circa 88-40 BC. Ae (bronze, 8.90 g, 28 mm). Helmeted bust of Athena right. Rev. AΠAMΕΩN / (magistrate) Eagle alighting right on maeander pattern; piloi of the dioskouroi to left and right, star above. Very fine.



PAMPHYLIA. Perge. Circa 260-230 BC. Ae (bronze, 5.01 g, 16 mm). Sphinx seated right, wearing kalathos. Rev. Artemis standing left, holding wreath and sceptre. Nearly very fine.



PISIDIA. Selge. Circa 2nd-1st centuries BC. Ae (bronze, 2.06 g, 11 mm). Head of Heracles right. Rev. Winged thunderbolt and club. Nearly very fine.



20 PHOENICIA. Tyre. 126/5 BC-65/6 AD. Shekel (silver, 12.10 g, 28 mm), CY 22 (105/4 BC). Laureate head of Melkart to right, lion skin tied around neck. Rev. TYPOY IEPAΣ KAI ΑΣΥΛΟΥ Eagle standing left on prow with palm frond behind, BK (date) above club in field to left, monogram in field to right; between eagle's legs, 'aleph'. Hendin 1618; Cf. DCA Suppl. 48. Very fine.
