Studia epigraphica Giovanni Mennella oblata (Armariolum 3), Rome 2021, pp. 261-276. (7.0 x 1.7 cm). Originally ring-shaped, later unfolded, resulting in the break of the central section.

Roman silver ring in the shape of a coiled snake. Circa 3rd - 2nd centuries BC. (inner diam. 2.0 cm). Crystallized object, snake's head twisted and fragile.



Roman silver ring featuring a woman and a crescent (?). Circa 2nd century BC. (inner diam. 1.8 cm). Deformed and crystallized rod, with a surface crack on one side extending toward the bezel.



Byzantine Bronze Bread Stamp, with high handle. Circa 4th - 7th centuries (5.4 x 2.7 cm). CEΦAH (retrograde), name in relief set in deep incuse. Attractive and natural green patina. The name "CEΦAH" is of Aramaic origin, derived from the Jewish/Aramaic word Kepha (אָפיֵכ), meaning "rock." It corresponds to Cephas, the original Semitic name of Saint Peter in the New Testament. Its presence on a Byzantine bread stamp reflects the multicultural and multilingual environment of the Eastern Roman Empire, where Semitic names were often rendered in Greek script. It may refer either to a person named Cephas or to a religious invocation linked to Saint Peter.



Medieval stud with eagle. Circa 13th century (Lead, 16.69 mm, 4.2 g).



Modern large stud with bridled horse head. After the antique (Bronze and lead, 57.02 mm, 46.71 g). Two iron pins covered by lead.
