1 Celts in Eastern Europe, circa 3rd century BC. Silver Tetradrachm (21 mm, 11.87 g.). "Kugelwange" Type. Celticised, bearded head wearing reversed laurel wreath to right. Rev. Stylised horse with point mane to left, under the horse's tail point, above large Θ (circle with dot), around border of dots. Göbl, OTA pl. 17, 193/3 (same dies); Lanz 465-66 (same dies). Toned in the deep areas, some areas of flatness, otherwise, nice very fine.



2 Celts in Eastern Europe, circa 3rd century BC. Silver Tetradrachm (25 mm, 11.28 g.). Celticised, laureate and bearded head of Zeus to right, within border of dots. Rev. Stylised naked rider to right. Deep test cuts, otherwise, fine.



Celtic Eastern Celtic Tribes, imitating imitations of Philip II of Macedon, circa 2nd.-1st. Century BC. Silver Drachm (13 mm, 2.29 g.) 'Kugelwange' type. Laureate head of Zeus to right. Rev. Stylized horse prancing left; above, wheel. Dembski 1110; Göbl, OTA 188; Slg. Flesche 612-614; Slg. Lanz 458-459. Very fine.



4 Imitative series, Island off Thasos, late 2nd-1st Century BC. AR Tetradrachm (32 mm, 16.24 g.). Stylized head of youthful Dionysos to right, wearing ivy wreath. Rev. ΛΕΥΞΚΣ ΣΚΤCΛΑ ΘΑΓΕΞΘ (partially retrograde). Stylized Herakles standing facing, head to left, resting his right hand on grounded club and carrying lion skin over his left arm. Good very fine with a lovely old cabinet tone nicely contrasting with the yellowish hues from the minting. Rare example of the imitative series from the Thasian tetradrachms with an interesting stylization of the legend and monogram.



5 Imitative series, Euboea. Histiaia, ca. 181-141 BC. Silver "Tetrobol" (11 mm, 0.59 g.). Wreathed head of the nymph Histiaia to right. Rev. I Σ T[I – AIE Ω N], nymph seated right on stern of galley; symbol wing on prow left; trident and TI below at left. HGC 4, 1525. Very thin and light example imitating a tetrobol, rude and irregular style. Rarer as an imitation.



Celts in Eastern Europe, circa 3rd - 2nd century BC. Silver Drachm (20 mm, 3.71 g.). Philip III Type. Celticised head of Herakles to right, wearing lion skin headdress. Border of dots. Rev. Stylised Zeus Aëtophoros seated to left, holding sceptre; remains of a legend to right - ΛΙΛ, monogram to left, inverted H under throne. BMC Celtic I, pl. 12, 200; Göbl, OTA pl. 45, 591/1 var.; Lanz 934-935. Deeply toned. Good very fine.



Sicily, Adranon, circa 339-317 BC. Bronze (19.5 mm, 8.20 g.). Laureate head of Apollo to left. Rev. Kithara. CNS 1; HGC 2, 37. Nice very fine with a wonderful olive green patina. Rare.



8 Gela. Circa 420-405 BC. Bronze Tetras or Trionkion (16 mm, 3.65 g.). Bull standing right; above, olive branch; in exergue, three pellets (mark of value). Rev. $\Gamma E \Lambda A \Sigma$ Horned head of the river god Gelas to right; behind, barley grain. CNS III 46. HGC 2, 380. Jenkins, Gela, 527-8. SNG ANS 120. Reverse struck slightly off-center, otherwise, nice very fine with a fine youth portrat and lovely olive green patina.



9 Moesia, Istros. Circa 400-350 BC. Silver Diobol (13 mm, 0.83 g.). Two facing male heads side by side, one upright and the other inverted - a tête-bêche pair. Rev. IΣΤΡΙΗ Sea eagle standing left on dolphin; below, ΦΑ. AMNG I 429. Cf. SNG BM Black Sea 234. Nice very fine.



10 Moesia, Istros. 4th Century BC. Silver Obol (8 mm, 0.37 g.). Two facing heads side by side, one reverted. Rev. I Σ TPIH, bird holding dolphin with claws. SNG Copenhagen 201 (var.). Very Fine, Rare.

11 Moesia, Kallatis. 3rd-2nd Century BC. Silver Drachm (17 mm, 5.13 g.). Head of Herakles to right, wearing lion skin headdress. Rev. [K]A/\ATI[A] Grain ear, club and bow in bowcase. AMNG I 196. HGC 3.2, 1825. SNG BM Black Sea 202. SNG Copenhagen 176. Nicely tone, about very fine.

Macedon, Kingdom. Philip II, 356-336 BC. Silver Tetradrachm (24 mm, 14.01 g.). Pella mint, circa 336-328 BC. Laureate head of Zeus to right. Rev. ΦΙΛΙΠ - ΠΟΥ, youth on horseback right, holding reins and long palm branch; grape bunch on vine below. Le Rider 421a; SNG ANS 425; HCG 3.1, 863. Test-cut on reverse. Very fine.



Macedon, Kingdom. Philip II of Macedon, 356-336 BC. Bronze (18.7 mm, 6.40 g.). Uncertain mint in Macedonia. Diademed head of Apollo to right. Rev. ΦΙΛΙΠΠΟΥ, youth on horseback to right; below – monogram YE. SNG ANS 894; HGC 3.1, Lovely natural olive green patina, about good very fine with a fine classical portrait of Apollo.



28 Macedon, Kingdom, Alexander III 'the Great', Silver Tetradrachm (26 mm, 17.16 g.). Tyre mint, Struck under the reign of Philip III Arrhidaios, under Laomedon. Dated RY 29 of Azemilkos (321/0 BC). Head of Herakles right, wearing lion skin. Rev. Zeus Aëtophoros seated left; in left field, Phoenician 'Z (king's name) above Phoenician date. Price 3275 (Ake); Newell, Dated 31. About extremely fine, very well centred and detailed.



29 Macedon, Kingdom. Alexander III 'the Great', 336-323 BC. Silver Tetradrachm (31.4 mm, 16.84 g.). Stasion, magistrate. Posthumous issue of Rhodes mint, circa 201-190 BC. Head of Herakles to right, wearing lion skin. Rev. ΑΛΕΞΑΝΔΡΟΥ, Zeus Aëtophoros seated left on a high throne, holding eagle and scepter, right leg drawn back; in outer left field, ΣΤΑΣΙΩΝ over rose, between legs of the throne, PO. Price 2517; SNG Copenhagen 763; Kleiner, The Alexander Tetradrachms of Pergamum and Rhodes, ANS MN 17 (1971), 108, Series XII. Struck on a broad, large flan as usual for this issue. Nicely toned. Good very fine struck on a huge flan and of the finest style.

ΑΛΕΞΑΝΔΡΟΥ, Zeus seated left on backless throne, right leg drawn back, feet on stool, eagle in outstretched right hand, grounded scepter in left. A below strut. Price 2637. About very fine.



35 Macedon, Kingdom, Philip III Arrhidaios, 323-317 BC. (15 mm, 4.80 g.), struck under Nikokreon in Salamis, circa 323-315 BC. Macedonian shield with facing gorgoneion on boss. Rev. B A Macedonian helmet facing, caduceus to left. Liampi Series II, Group 6, 170-92. Price 3158. Wonderful untouched dark green patina, and with a gorgoneion engraved in high relief, perfectly defined and well centered. Good very fine. Rarely seen in this condition.



36 Macedon, Kingdom. Antigonos II Gonatas, 277/6-239 BC. Silver Tetradrachm (31 mm, 16.94 g). Amphipolis mint. Macedonian shield with head of Pan left on boss. Rev. BAΣIΛΕΩΣ – ANTIΓONOY, Athena advancing left, brandishing thunderbolt and holding shield decorated with aegis. Controls: Macedonian helmet to inner left, HP monogram to inner left, HP monogram to inner right. SNG Copenhagen 1200; HGC 3.1, 1042. Perfectly centered and a broad flan, short test cut, otherwise, very fine.



37 Illyria, Dyrrhachion. Circa 270/10-60 BC. Silver Hemidrachm (15 mm, 1.60 g.). Forepart of cow standing right, AP above. Rev. Δ YP Δ YP Divided double square containing two stellate designs. HGC 3.1, 41 var. (magistrate on the reverse not recorded for the denomination). Reverse struck slightly off center, otherwise, nice very fine with a nice dark toning. Extremely rare as a hemidrachm.



Macedon, Roman Protectorate, 168-167 BC. Time of Aemilius Paullus, C. Publilius, quaestor. Bronze (24 mm, 14.10 g.). Helmeted head of Roma to right, wearing winged Phrygian helmet. Rev. TAMIOY ΓΑΙΟΥ / ΠΟΠΛΙΛΙΟΥ, Oak wreath within. AMNG p. 66, 203; SNG Copenhagen 1318; HGC 3, 1114. Very fine. A rare variant without MAKEΔΟΝΩΝ in the legend.



39 Kings of Paeonia, Patraos, circa 335-315 BC. Silver Tetradrachm (22 mm, 11.90 g.). Astibos or Damastion. Laureate head of Apollo to right. Rev. ΠΑ-ΤΡΑΟ-Υ Paeonian horseman, wearing crested helmet and full armor, galloping to right and spearing fallen enemy, who defends himself with a with a spear in his right hand and a shield on his left arm. HGC 3.1, 148. Reverse slightly off center, an old scuff, otherwise, nice very fine with a nice old cabinet tone. Of the finest style with a wonderful portrait of Apollo.



40 Illyria, Dyrrhachion. Circa 270/10-60 BC. Silver Hemidrachm (15 mm, 1.60 g.). Forepart of cow standing right, AP above. Rev. Δ YP Δ YP Divided double square containing two stellate designs. HGC 3.1, 41 var. (magistrate on the reverse not recorded for the denomination). Reverse struck slightly off center, otherwise, nice very fine with a nice dark toning. Extremely rare as a hemidrachm.

BMC Crete pg. 130, 27; SNG Copenhagen 783. Very fine with a wonderful green patina. Very rare, especially this type where Poseidon holding only trident and the dolphin is at feet.



49 Attica, Athens. 138/7 BC. Silver Tetradrachm (31 mm, 16.89 g.). "New style", "stephanephoric" coinage, struck under the magistrates Glaukos and Eche... Head of Athena Parthenos to right, wearing a triple-crested Attic helmet, adorned with Pegasos and a long tendril on the bowl, and with four serpents on the visor. Rev. A- Θ E / Γ Λ/AY -EXE Owl standing facing on amphora; to right, draped and radiate facing bust of Helios; on amphora, E (= 5th month); to left of owl, KT (= contractor's initials); all within olive wreath. Thompson - 292. Dark and iridescent toning. An impressive example struck on a broad flan, an awesome contrast of dark and yellowish iridescent tone, about extremely fine.
