Athens formed an alliance with Sitalces to secure Thracian support and threaten the allies of Sparta.

Married Laodice, daughter of Mithridates II of Pontus. Appointed commander of all Asia west of Mount Taurus in 223 BC and then recovered Seleucid territories from Attalus I of Pergamum. The fourth Syrian war and the preoccupation of Antiochus and his army with Ptolemy IV and Molon provided Achaeus the opportunity to declare himself king in Phrygia in the autumn of 220, thus finally severing the ties with Antiochus III. In 218 BC Attalus regained control over the Greek cities of northern Ionia, Aeolis and Troas and the Mysian lands as far east as the Megistos river, which occupied Achaeus during the fourth Syrian war. He held power only until Antiochus had reached a peace with Ptolemy, and issued bronze coinage in his name; Antiochus then allied with Attalus to retake the territory Achaeus had claimed. Achaeus withstood a seige in the citadel of Sardis for two years. After sustaining a siege of two years, the citadel at last fell into the hands of Antiochus in 213 BC, through the treachery of Bolis (who had been employed by Sosibius, minister to Ptolemy). Bolis pledged to deliver Achaeus to safety, but turned him over to Antiochus, who immediately put him to death.

Upon marriage, she was given the prestigious title of Augusta, signifying her status as empress. Coins were minted with her image, often featuring the goddess Concordia, symbolizing harmony in marriage. The obverse depicts the bride and gives her the title of Augusta, which is known to have been granted to Julia Paula upon her marriage to Elagabalus, while the reverse features Concordia-a wish for a happy relationship between imperial husband and wife. Alas, there was little concord between Paula and Elagabalus once the wedding was over and the marriage started. Their marriage was short-lived, as Elagabalus divorced her in 220 AD. Julia Paula was one of the few Roman empresses who voluntarily left imperial life rather than being executed or exiled.

This coin bears the name of the archon Ph. Proklos, known from the coins of Septimius Severus minted in Abydos. It first appears with Julia Domna on this specimen. The coins of Abydos in the name of Julia Domna are also quite rare.

Athena, on the other hand, has been of great importance to the city of Ilium since its founding and is associated with the city's founding mythology. His depiction of these two important figures of the city in the Roman Empire must be a sign of Romans respect and devotion to his roots.
