Cumae was the earliest Greek colony found in Magna Grecia, founded by Euboeans, who had previously settled at Πιθηκο?σσαι (Ischia). Their coinage began to be minted around 475 BC, after the great defeat of the Etruscans at sea off the coast of Cumae. After a brief period of experiment using the Attic and Chalcidian weight standards, the Phocaic standard adopted by Velia came to be used at Cumae and other Campanian cities. The types display considerable variety and, especially, around 430-420 BC, a second class of more mythological symbols began to appear on the coins, such as with this specimen. On the obverse, the female head may perhaps represent the nymph Kyme as personification of the city, or possibly the famous Cumaean sibyl or the siren Parthenope. On the reverse, however, the musselshell is an example of the παρασημον of a city borrowed from among the natural products of the locality; the shallow salt-lakes Avernus and Lucrinus being particularly adapted to the cultivation of shellfish.

In the historical record the site on the Thracian coast that would become Abdera was first settled in 654 B.C. by colonists from Clazomenae. That early effort failed, evidently because of conflicts with warlike Thracians. One hundred and ten years later, in 544, a new colonization effort was made by citizens of another Ionian city, Teos, who under the cover of night abandoned their homes rather than live under newly imposed Persian rule. When the Abderites began to produce coins, they chose to portray a griffin, as it was familiar from the coins of their mother-city. No doubt symbolically, the griffin faces left on issues of Abdera and faces right on those of Teos. Silver, fish, wine and grain were among the commodities that allowed Abdera to accumulate its astonishing wealth. The people of Abdera had a longstanding conflict with the Greeks on the nearby island of Thasos, as they competed for control of trade in the Thracian hinterland. It has been suggested that in 491 the Abderites fabricated a rumour that the Thasians were planning a revolt against the authority of Persia. Consequently, Darius forced the Thasians to tear down their walls and to deliver their ships to Abdera. In 463/2 Abdera again was able to profit from the misfortunes of the Thasians when their revolt against Athens was crushed. Abdera's wealth is evident not only from the large quantity of silver coins it produced and exported - often to the Egyptian delta - but also from the records of the Delian League. During the period 453 to 432 Abdera contributed annually about 15 talents to the league, suggesting its total payments may have been surpassed only by Aegina, Byzantium and Thasos.

After decades of providing the military backbone of Roman expansion, the Italic allies (socii in Latin) of Rome felt that they deserved more of the benefits than they had previously received. In short, they wanted Roman citizenship so that they would have a greater say in Rome's wars of conquest and changes to the system of land distribution that had concentrated vast swathes of arable land in the hands of the Roman elite. The disenchantment of the Italic socii with Rome came to a head in 91 BC, when M. Livius Drusus was murdered, probably through the agency of the consuls L. Marcius Philippus and Sextus Julius Caesar. He had been championing Italic rights and had drawn a large following as a means of forcing through a variety of social reforms in opposition to the consuls. This bloodshed sparked the Italic peoples, who may or may not have previously sworn an oath to be the protectors of Drusus, to give up their status as Roman allies and form an independent federal state known as the Italic Confederation with a capital at Corfinium, which was renamed Italica. Although the confederation included the Frentani, Hirpini, Iapygii, Lucanians, Marrucini, Marsi, Paeligni, Picentines, Pompeians, Samnites, Venusians, and Vestini, leadership was primarily in the hands of the Marsi and Samnites. Raising an army of 120,000 men, in 90 BC, the Italic consuls Q. Poppaedius Silo and C. Papius Mutilus and began a war against the Romans in the north and in the south, respectively. The Marsi defeated and killed P. Rutilius Lupus, the Roman consul sent against them, while at the same time, Mutilus made inroads into Campania, Lucania, and Apulia, drawing several additional cities and peoples into the Italic Confederacy. Although the Roman consul L. Julius Caesar, managed to roll back much of the Italic advance in the south, Rome remained in crisis. Fearing that other socii might break their alliances with Rome and join the rebels, Caesar enacted a law giving full rights of Roman citizenship to allied cities and peoples who had not already

After the death of his favourite nephew Marcellus, Augustus' hopes for the succession turned to the young Caius and Lucius Caesars, his grandsons via his daughter Julia and his close friend and confidant, Marcus Agrippa. Caius was born in 20 BC and Lucius three years later. After the death of Agrippa in 12 BC, Augustus formally adopted both boys and accelerated their progress up the cursus honorum, or ladder of public offices. He also carefully supervised their education and displayed them at public events to endear them to the populace and army. "Augustus gave Caius and Lucius reading, swimming and other simple lessons, for the most part acting as their tutor himself," writes Suetonius. Cauis was officially presented by Augustus to the public in 5 BC, and he became Consul in AD 1 at the age of 21. This was an extremely young age for so high an office, although Augustus probably viewed his own consulship at age 19 as an adequate precedent. During Caius' consulship, Augustus sent him on a tour of the eastern frontier with special powers to reassert Roman authority in Armenia. Augustus took care to select experienced advisors for the youth, and the expedition was largely successful. But a brief border conflict broke out with the Parthians in AD 3, and Caius received a wound during a siege. Though not mortally wounded, the injury sapped his energy and he grew ill and depressed. He died at Limyra in Asia Minor, en route back to Italy, in February of AD 4. Lucius had likewise fallen ill and had died in Mas- salia two years before, and the deaths left Augustus utterly bereft and devastated. Their demise also cleared the way for Tiberius, Augustus' dour son-inlaw via his wife Livia, to succeed to imperial power, and rumours abounded that Livia had somehow conspired in the deaths of Caius and Lucius. Such speculation makes for lurid reading and viewing (most notably in the book and television series, "I, Claudius"), but the disparate circumstances of their deaths leaves little doubt regarding Livia's innocence. This rare gold aureus, struck in the Gallic capital of Lugdunum (modern Lyon) in 8 BC, depicts Caius Caesar as a junior cavalry officer, charging headlong on his mount with sword and shield. As Caius would have been at most 12 years old at the time of striking the coin

The Praetorian Guard originated during Republican times as a small troop of specially selected guards for Roman generals while encamped; by the reign of Augustus, the troops were drawn from the elite of Rome's legions throughout the empire and it had become the personal domain of the emperor, serving to protect his person as well as that of the imperial family. In A.D. 22/3 the praetorian prefect, Sejanus, convinced Tiberius to construct a camp for the troops, the Castra Praetoria, the walls of which are depicted on the reverse of this coin. The camp was erected just outside the north-eastern boundary of Rome, between the Viminalis and Colline Gates beyond the Servian Wall. The location both allayed concerns from the populace about having armed troops within the city itself, but also by its very proximity served as a healthy reminder which discouraged any sort of civil disorder. Being physically disabled and suffering a severe speech impediment, Claudius was a longshot for the imperial purple. His elevation came about immediately after the assassination of his nephew, the former emperor Gaius Caligula, who had treated him cruelly by making him the butt of jokes due to his physical ailments. When the praetorians stormed the palace in the aftermath of their assassination of Caligula, Claudius was discovered hiding amongst the curtains. His fears that he would also be killed, however, proved unfounded; the guardsmen immediately hailed him emperor and took him to the Castra Praetoria, where Claudius then pronounced he would pay each praetorian a bonus of 15,000 sestertii (150 aurei). Thus dramatically secured in his accession, Claudius recognized the support of the Praetorian Guard with two issues of coinage, this type showing a guardsman (or more likely Fides Praetorianorum - see RIC I p. 149, 6) standing behind the battlemented walls of the camp with the legend IMPER(atore) RECEPT(o), and a second type showing him greeting a soldier and with the legend PRAETOR(ianus) RECEPT(us) (RIC 11ff). Both types were employed on aurei and denarii during the first three years of Claudius' reign, although this reverse alone saw continued use until A.D. 47. During the later third century, three of the Praetorian camp's four walls were

incorporated into construction of the Walls of Aurelian. The camp

The Temple of Janus - the god of beginnings and endings - was one of Rome's most ancient. It was believed that Romulus built it after he made peace with the Sabines, and that king Numa decreed its doors should be opened during war and shut during times of peace. Its doors had been shut perhaps five or six times in all Roman history prior to the reign of Nero - once under king Numa (who originated the tradition), once at the end of the Second Punic War, three times under Augustus, and, according to Ovid, once under Tiberius. Thus, when in 65 peace had been generally established on all the empire's fronts, Nero did not hesitate to close the temple's doors. He marked the event with great celebrations and struck a large and impressive series of coins. The inscription on this issue is one of the most instructive on all Roman coins, for it announces the doors of Janus have been closed after peace has been procured for the Roman People on the land and on the sea". Despite Nero's contentment with affairs on the empire's borders, the year 65 was not a happy one on the home front: much of Rome was still in ashes from the great fire of the previous year, Nero had narrowly escaped murder in the Pisonian conspiracy, and not long afterward he had kicked to death his pregnant wife Poppaea.

After rejecting a proposal by a Parthian embassy in Athens, Trajan moved onto Antioch, where he wintered in preparation for the anticipated Armenian campaign of 114. After the successful conclusion of this initial campaign, Trajan once again wintered in Antioch, and in the spring of 115 led his army into northern Mesopotamia and Adiabene; he found success in both places and added the former to the Empire. Trajan's greatest triumph, however, did not come until 116, when he once again left Antioch, initially to revisit Adiabene, and then to march down the Tigris and sack the Parthian capital Ctesiphon. The campaign was an enormous success: the capital was stripped of its legendary wealth and by mid-116 the defeat of Parthia seemed complete. Afterward, Trajan felt sufficiently secure to make a brief excursion to the Persian Gulf. However, he soon realized his gains were ephemeral, and in an effort to preserve some control over the Parthians he installed the pro-Roman king Parthamaspates on the throne, but his puppet-king did not fare well. At the end of Trajan's long and productive life, he witnessed the consequences of his decades of expansionism, as revolts erupted in Armenia, Mesopotamia, Cyprus, Egypt, Cyrene, western North Africa and the Empire's northern borders in Europe. Before Trajan could march westward to address some of these uprisings, he died while encamped in Cilicia. His successor, Hadrian, scaled back Trajan's expanded empire to a more manageable size and as a result enjoyed a relatively peaceful reign. This aureus was struck at the height of Trajan's success, and is dated by Woytek to 116. The reverse type is of an ancient and familiar composition, with two dejected captives seated at the base of a trophy composed of arms and armour. In this case the captives are in Parthian attire with bows-in-cases upright at their feet. Beneath is the explicit and unapologetic inscription PARTHIA CAPTA.

Of the five men proclaimed emperor in the civil war that raged from 193 to 197, Helvius Pertinax was perhaps the most admirable and deserving. Born in north-west Italy the son of a timber merchant, Pertinax was a self-made man who abandoned a career in teaching to join the army. His talents must have been exceptional, for he gained powerful friends attached to the family of Marcus Aurelius, married the daughter of an ex-consul, and by his early 50s this son of a freedman was elected into the senate. In 175 he and another contender of the distant civil war, Didius Julianus, were both named suffect consuls. There seemed no limits to his capabilities, for he commanded a legion, governed Moesia Inferior, Dacia, Syria, Britain and Africa, and when the palace coup unfolded against Commodus on New Year's Eve, 192, Pertinax was the urban prefect of Rome and had opened that year sharing the consulship with Commodus. With such stellar qualifications it is hardly surprising that Pertinax was chosen by the senate to replace Commodus. Being in such powerful positions within the capital, he was privy to all of the outrages of government, and during his 86 days as emperor he attempted to reform some of the most egregious abuses. These efforts inspired two coups against him - one that failed, and another that succeeded. The mercy he showed the conspirators the first time did not impress the praetorian guards, who also organized the second plot and murdered him after storming the palace. His father-in-law Flavius Sulpicianus may not have been an ally after all, for he openly competed with Didius Julianius when the guardsmen put the throne up for auction in arguably the most degrading episode in Roman history.
