Titus Flavius Vespasianus, was one of the most highly appreciated figures of ancient Rome, known for his brief but significant reign between AD 79 and 81. He came to the throne upon the death of his father Vespasian, at the height of the 'Pax Romana', and was able to distinguish himself by a leadership style marked by benevolence, compassion, and a sense of responsibility to the people. His commitment to the welfare of the citizens was evident early on: he reduced taxes, forgave some debts, and was actively involved in the reconstruction of Rome after the eruption of Vesuvius, which had destroyed Pompeii and Herculaneum in the very year of his ascension. His administrative and economic reforms sought not only to stabilize the empire but also to improve its quality of life. Titus also showed great concern for cities in economic distress, to which he provided concrete aid. In addition to his social policy, Titus championed major public works, most notably the construction of the Colosseum, the most famous Roman amphitheater. Its inauguration in AD 80 was celebrated with shows and games that lasted 100 days, including gladiators, hunts and naval battles, demonstrating his desire to provide entertainment and strengthen the sense of unity among the peoples of the Empire. From a military point of view, Titus was an experienced commander. He led the successful siege of Jerusalem in AD 70, during the Jewish War, and also intervened in Britain, consolidating the stability of the imperial borders. These victories contributed to his reputation as a capable leader, both in battle and in domestic politics. However, his reign was not without difficulties. He faced natural disasters and occasional tensions with the Senate, which struggled to accept the increasing centralization of imperial power. Some criticism also came to him for the pomp of the festivities at the Colosseum, at a time when many citizens were still dealing with the aftermath of the eruption. On a personal level, Titus was loved for his affable character. Raised in a family of military tradition, he received a thorough cultural education and developed a cultured and refined personality. He was briefly married to Marcia Furnilla, by whom he had a daughter, Julia Flavia, and had a relationship with Queen Berenice of Judea, which, however, never resulted in marriage. He loved art, culture and sumptuous living, elements that humanized his figure even in his imperial guise. He died

In 100, Hadrian married Vibia Sabina, the emperor's grandniece. He then followed the cursus honorum and became governor of Syria in 117, when Trajan died. At the time of the emperor's death, Hadrian was not only one of his closest and most eligible relatives, but he was also not far away. It was Plotina, Trajan's wife, who wanted to adopt Hadrian. It is unclear what happened when Trajan died, having fallen ill in Cilicia during the campaign against the Parthians. Hadrian's adoption, according to the historian Cassius Dio, was announced to the Roman Senate with a false letter from Trajan, actually written by Plotina. Hadrian however kept both women close and allowed Matidia to assist him until she died in 119 AD. At her death the emperor granted her a touching eulogy and organised spectacular gladiatorial games, and finally deified her by having a temple built in Rome. The reverse of this Denarius celebrates Hadrian's accession to the throne, showing the handover from Trajan, who is clasping his hand and implying that the former emperor himself had approved this succession. In fact at the prince's death the senate received letters from Trajan mentioning Hadrian's adoption, but according to Cassius Dio they were signed by his widow Plotina. Probably Lucius Licinius Sura, his future and greatest general, also made great efforts for Trajan to consider Hadrian's candidacy. Hadrian is remembered as a literate monarch, a lover of Greek letters and neosophistic philosophy. The new emperor had a very different political conception from that of his predecessor, beginning with the renouncing of the expansionism so much desired by Trajan in order to focus more on the defense of imperial borders, as evidenced by the construction of Hadrian's Wall. His reign was also marked by the travels he embarked on between 121 and 132, a way of learning about and expressing respect for every corner of the empire. Indeed, he visited numerous regions and garrisons, reserving special interest for the armies and the discipline of the soldiers. Despite his efforts to avoid any armed conflict, Hadrian had to deal with a Jewish revolt that erupted because he had renamed Jerusalem as the Colonia Aelia Capitolina, after his family name, for having a temple dedicated to Jupiter Capitolinus erected there and for forbidding circumcision, a custom he perceived as barbaric, despite not being hostile to Judaism. The revolt was very bloody and led by Simon bar Kochba, who lost his life in the last battle. In internal politics Hadrian gave his best, eliminating unnecessary expenses and undertaking magnificent public works, not only in Rome. He also asked his jurists to collect all edicts that would ensure greater justice for the weaker, but went to the disadvantage of the Senate, which responded with conspiracies. Hadrian managed to escape these attempts and sent all the conspirators to death, earning himself a very bad reputation. For this he publicly apologized and engaged in a series of food concessions to the people, forgave a huge amount of debt, and promised not to use any more violence against the senators. Promise that he did not

Rare Born to a daughter of Gordian I, sister of Gordian II, because of the young age at which he came to occupy the throne (13), Gordian did not rule directly, but the Senate did so for him. Gordian had become prince because the Senate needed to placate an uprising of the traditionalist urban plebs, bound to the dynastic ideal, and in order to take advantage of his family's wealth. Moreover, the praetorians had acclaimed him emperor just to show the Senate that they were the ones who decided who to put on the throne. Among the first moves was the dismissal of the legion in Africa because it had supported Capellianus and led to the deaths of Gordian I and II, who were deified. During his relatively long tenure there were several problems to deal with. In 240 Sabinianus, elected caesar in Carthage, prepared to make war on him, but was stopped by the governor of Mauretania. In the north the barbarians were making constant raids and sacking villages and towns. Gordian was too young to face these problems, but fortunately for him he could count on the diplomatic and military skill of Timesitheus, who had become prefect of the praetorium and granted him his daughter, Tranquillina, in marriage in 241. Rome succeeded in repelling the Persians of Shapur I in 243 thanks to Timesitheus, but on his death he was replaced as prefect of the praetorium by Marcus Julius Philip known as 'the Arab'. The latter, however, was not satisfied with this title but aimed at the throne, and he convinced the army that they needed an adult prince and not a boy. Gordian showed maturity and offered to cede the throne to Philip and become his caesar, but he was killed in 244. The Senate was informed that he had died of wounds sustained in a battle against the Persians. His body was sent to Rome where he was deified. Condition: Near mint state. Weight: 5.19 g. After the death of Postumus, he held power for perhaps two or three days before being killed by a sword of his own making. After serving as protector domesticus (personal guard) of Julian II and Jovian, he immediately became emperor of the East in 364 thanks to his brother who was already Augustus of the West, although the two differed in faith. Valens in fact was an Arian, while Valentinian was a Nicene Christian. The first problem was presented by the usurper Procopius, comes of Antioch, who proclaimed himself Augustus of the East in 365. Valens defeated him, sentenced him to death and struck with damnatio memoriae. He later faced the Visigoths and a second conspiracy, hatched by Theodore of Antioch. In 374 Valens celebrated the decennalia and became Maximus Augustus in 375 on the death of his brother, after which he organized an expedition against the Persians that proved unsuccessful, forcing him to sign an unfavorable peace. Another problem was the confluence of Ostrogoths and Visigoths into Roman territory across the Danube because of the advance of the Huns. The Romans were forced to accept them, but this integration was not easy; the Visigoths felt oppressed and exploited as a labor-power, resulting in an insurrection. Valens, considered a general of little ability by his contemporaries, was thus induced to recruit Goth mercenaries, with the risk that they would end up allied with his enemies. In fact, a large contingent of Visigoths, Ostrogoths, Huns, and Alamanni joined forces to fight the Romans and achieved a decisive victory at Hadrianopolis (Thrace) in 378. The tremendous defeat was caused by Gratian, who was meanwhile on the Western throne and did not arrive in time with his troops. Valens died in the battle but the Goths failed to conquer Constantinople. Tiberius III, called Apsimar, was a late Roman usurper of probably Germanic origin who rose to power with the support of the mutinous army against Emperor Leontius. Similar to Phocas, his rise was a classic military enthronement, with the support of the Green faction of Constantinople, enemies of the Blue and critics of Leontius' rule. Despite limited documentation, it is known that Tiberius III maintained a continuity line policy with the Heraclian dynasty, although he did not belong to it, and showed military efficiency. He initiated a counteroffensive in Syria and Asia Minor, achieving moderate successes against the Arabs and initiating a new offensive strategy. In Africa, he adopted a pragmatic strategy: contacts with the Berbers and consolidation of the remaining Byzantine positions, delaying the Arab advance toward Spain for years. The fall of Carthage led to the creation of new "themes" (military provinces): Sicily, Sardinia and probably Calabria, inspired by the eastern administrative model. Sicily became a strategic center, while Sardinia, too isolated, remained vulnerable. In 701 Tiberius III appointed Theophylact as the new exarch of Italy. His arrival was marked by instability: local armies mutinied and besieged Rome, fearing new imperial interference. Pope John VI managed to calm the situation, but Byzantine rule in Italy was evidently fragile. The Lombards of Benevento took advantage of this and in 702 conquered Sora, Arpino and Arce, threatening Rome. Justinian II, the deposed emperor, fled from confinement and found refuge with the Kazari, marrying the Khan's sister (baptized Theodora). After a failed extradition attempt by Tiberius III, he took refuge with the Bulgarians, promising the Khan Tervel entry to Constantinople and the title "Caesar of the Romans." In 705, Justinian II returned with a Bulgarian-Slavic army. With the help of loyalists, he managed to enter the city via an abandoned aqueduct as Tiberius fled. Tiberius III was captured in Bithynia. Taken to Constantinople, he was executed at the hippodrome together with Leontius in front of the crowd. The episode marked the beginning of a harsh purge by Justinian II, who returned to power. The reign of Tiberius III, although born of usurpation, was distinguished by military and administrative competence. He was able to continue the Heraclian legacy in a very difficult context, but was overwhelmed

Commercial and military relations with the Turks were intense and peaceful. Sultan Suleiman the Magnificent, ruler of a vast but internally unstable empire due to political and religious tensions, sought to strengthen his position through military campaigns, choosing Hungary as his first target. In 1526, Hungary was easily defeated by the Turks, but they did not immediately occupy it. The West did not intervene: the Pope was more concerned with Luther and Charles V, while Luther himself justified not opposing the Turks. Austria took advantage of the power vacuum in Hungary and installed Ferdinand of Habsburg as king, but the use of violent troops generated hostility. The Turks then supported the deposed King Zapolya to oppose Ferdinand, initiating a long conflict. In 1529, Suleiman besieged Vienna, not to conquer Europe, but to obtain recognition of Zapolya's rule over Hungary. The siege failed due to logistical problems and the onset of winter, but the Turks consolidated their presence in Hungary. A period of intermittent warfare followed, lasting until a provisional peace was signed in 1562. Meanwhile, Austria was abandoned by the Christian West: France allied with Suleiman, while the other European powers were too absorbed in internal religious conflicts to concern themselves with the Hungarian issue, which had by then come to be seen as an internal matter of the Habsburg Empire.
