The Greek colonial presence on the coasts of southern Italy and in Sicily generated very important cities and significant coin productions, initially characterized by the “incuse coin phenomenon,” which featured reverse types equal to obverse types, but in negative instead of relief. This was not simply an embossed worked foil, but an actual minting process, which involved the use of a reverse die with types rendered in relief. Various hypotheses have been advanced over time regarding this choice; there was probably a desire on the part of the Magna Graecia cities to differentiate these coins from those produced by the other Greek mints. Moreover, it could have been an expedient that made overstruck difficult, thus avoiding one of the possible causes of coin migration to places far from the issuing centers. This coin type was clearly intended for a local Magna Graecia market, as the hoards data show. Hence the existence of a circulation area controlled by the Magnogrean cities is assumed. The coinage of Sybaris is based on the “Achaean-Corinthian” weight system, with a stater of 7.80-8g, divided into three drachms, also used by Tarentum and other colonies of Achaean origin, such as Metapontion, Kroton and Kaulonia. The destruction of the city by Croton in 510 is a very important chronological term. Sybaris must have begun minting incuse coinage around 530 and may have been the first to introduce this type of coinage. The Egyptians were an exception because they used both methods at the same time, creating a civil calendar and a religious one. The civil calendar was based on Sothis, which moves parallel to the sun and, with its sunrise, marked the beginning of the annual flooding of the Nile. On the reverse, the cippus bears the inscription "S(enatus) P(opulusque) R(omanum), Imp(eratori) Caes(ari), quod v(iae) m(unitae) s(unt) ex ea p(ecunia) q(uam) is ad a(erarium) d(etulit)" (= by decision of the Senate and the Roman people, to the Emperor and Caesar, for having reinforced the roads with funds he paid to the public treasury) and refers to Augustus' donation to the treasury of the sum of money necessary for the renovation of the Via Flaminia, as narrated by Cassius Dio and the emperor himself in the 'Res Gestae'. The memorial stone probably really existed and was erected in Rome to celebrate the event. Rare With the famous Battle of Mursa in 351 Constantius II inflicted a severe defeat on Magnentius, who two years later killed himself along with his brother Decentius, caesar of the West. This marked the beginning of a united kingdom for the winner, who at that point needed a caesar with a view to dynastic succession. Constantius appointed his cousin Constantius Gallus, who married Constantina, sister of the emperor and widow of Hanniballianus. Constantius Gallus was an able general who had brought down several Persian revolts. He had made himself hated not so much for his despotic ways as for his pro-poor monetary policy, in contrast to that initiated by Constantine and continued by Constantius II in favor of gold coinage and the wealthier classes. This led to his eventual assassination by a conspiracy of the Antioch aristocracy and his 'damnatio memoriae'. Because of his young age he was spared in the 337 massacre of Constantine's family members. His youthful education at the court of Constantius II was in the care of the pagan eunuch Mardonius, marked by the myth of classical culture and paganism, particularly Neoplatonism. Upon the death of Constantius Gallus, Julian took his place as Caesar in 355 and married Constantius II's sister, Helena, after which he immediately left to fight the Germans who had invaded Colonia Agrippinensium. Here, after a series of fights, he succeeded in winning the favor of the people and the army, who acclaimed him Augustus in 360, raising the ire of Constantius II. Upon the latter's death Julian became sole emperor and moved back to Constantinople, beginning to deprive the Christian Church of all the rights that had been granted to it by its predecessors, thus earning the appellation "Apostate." Although he never openly persecuted Christians, his policies undoubtedly favored pagans and Jews. Julian also distinguished himself as a man of culture, writing several works, both satirical and philosophical. His main goal was to get the Romans to return to worshiping the ancient gods, and he thought he would succeed by winning the war against the Persians of Shapur II. After a series of victories the emperor reached the gates of Ctesiphon in June 363, but at that point he hesitated and, instead of attacking the city, decided to wait until he rejoined Procopius' army. This move proved fatal, for after a hard fight at Maranga on the Tigris, he was wounded and killed at Samarra.
