## SESSION ONE

## The Dodo Collection

The Dodo Collection, named in honor of the large, flightless and long extinct bird and which was only found on the island of Mauritius, has a long and storied history and comes to tonight's auction directly from the exotic island of Mauritius. Mauritius has long been part of an important trade route linking India, Africa, and the Arabian Peninsula. The island's remote location has led to a number of philatelic and numismatic rarities. For example, one of the rarest and most valuable postage stamps in the world, the so-called 1847 Blue Penny (Two Pence) stamp (along with a companion orange-red One Penny value) became the first British Empire postage stamp ever produced outside of Great Britain. Only a handful of the Blue Penny issue stamps is known, one of which was held by our consignor's family for a period of time.

The collection, which includes many bank note rarities from Mauritius, as well as notes from India and Zanzibar, has been intact for nearly 100 years. In that time, it has been held by the family of the consignor that has been part of the island's history for nearly two centuries. Collections like this are rarely seen today. Some of the bank note highlights include:

Government of Mauritius 5 Rupees 1.7.1924 Pick 16 This design was issued between 1907 and 1930, with 177,000 notes placed in circulation between 1924 and 1926. The notes were withdrawn from circulation at the end of 1934. This example is in far above average condition for this issue and, in fact, is tied with only one other note for the highest reported grade for this Pick number in the PMG population report.

Government of Mauritius 10 Rupees 1.1.1927 Pick 17235,000 of this large format denomination note were issued between 1924 and 1932, with all notes being withdrawn from circulation by 1934. Absent from many African and British Commonwealth collections, this note is difficult to find in any condition. At present, only nine notes have been graded by PMG, with this example being, by far, the finest graded and the only note to receive the grading service's EPQ designation.

Government of Mauritius 10 Rupees 7.8.1900 Pick 14 Around 568,458 of this denomination were issued between 1876 and 1904, with all notes being withdrawn from circulation in 1934.This design and denomination is difficult to locate in any grade. At present, this is the only example graded by PMG.

Government of Mauritius 10 Rupees 1.5.1913 Pick 17 This design was issued between 1907 and 1930, with around 265,000 notes placed in circulation between 1913 and 1921 before being withdrawn from circulation at the end of 1934. PMG only records nine examples of this note design and denomination in its population report.

Government of Mauritius 5 Rupees 30.8.1909 Pick 16 323,000 notes of this design were issued between 1907 and 1911, ultimately being withdrawn from circulation on December 15, 1934. Like the other notes highlighted here, this note is rare and seldom offered, with even the date being unlisted in the standard references.

Zanzibar Government 10 Rupees 1.1.1908 Pick 3 Notes from this exotic locale have seen increasing popularity and interest as collectors specializing in Africa seek to add an example to their collections. PMG lists only five examples of this design in their population report.


28001 Angola Banco De Angola 20 Angolares 1.6.1927 Pick 73 PMG Choice Very Fine 35.
The Bank of Angola was created in 1926, where the Angolares replaced the Portuguese Escudo. This denomination was issued in two colors, brown and red. Salvador de Sá, who secured Angola from the Dutch, is seen on the face. Colonial issues for Angola have significantly grown in popularity. Small tear.

28002 Argentina Provincia de Buenos Aires 4 Pesos Oro 1.1.1883 Pick S537s Specimen PMG Gem Uncirculated 66 EPQ.
A seldom seen and beautiful Specimen of this series. Issued examples as well as Specimens are very rare; hence the importance of this offering. At the time of cataloging, there are only two examples graded in the PMG Population Report, with this Specimen being the only one with Gem designation. Three POCs are seen.

28003 Australia Commonwealth Bank of Australia 10 Pounds ND (1949) Pick 28c R60 PMG Gem Uncirculated 65 EPQ.

An extremely scarce note in Uncirculated condition with only two notes registered above a AU 58 in the PMG Population Report. Large format and desirable with the Coombs and Watt signature combination. A premium example of this desirable type not to be missed.

28004 Austria Austrian National Bank 100 Schilling 3.1.1949 Pick 132s Specimen PMG Choice Uncirculated 64.
This beautiful post-World War II type is extremely scarce in Specimen form. In fact, this is the first we have offered. Red overprints, perforated cancellations, and staple holes are seen on this handsome, large format type. The issued variety is seldom seen in such collectible grade, and the Specimen type is even scarcer.

## Seldom Offered Azores Higher Denomination



28005 Azores Banco de Portugal 20 Mil Reis Ouro 1905 Pick 13 PMG Very Fine 30.
At the time of cataloging, the PMG Population Report has graded only one example finer than this offered note. Quite rare in any grade, this second highest denomination was overprinted on a contemporary Portuguese issue. Almost all offerings from Azores are scarce, with this problem free example being only the second we have offered. An important opportunity to acquire a very rare European type note.

28006 Azores Banco de Portugal 50 Mil Reis Ouro 30.1.1905 Pick 14 PMG Very Fine 25.
A visually stunning and seldom-seen highest denomination note. We have not offered this type since 2014, and there are very few examples existent. This type was overprinted on a Portuguese type, and is differentiated by a clause on the front middle of the note that reads: "Pagavel nas Agencias nos Acores". Minor rust and annotations are seen on this handsome original example.

28007 Bahamas Bahamas Government 1 Pound 1919 (ND 1930) Pick 7 PMG Choice Very Fine 35.
King George $V$ is seen on the face of this elegantly designed highest denomination from the second issue. The last offering we made for this variety in the same grade sold for just over $\$ 2,000$ in 2017.

28008 Bahamas Bahamas Government 5 Pounds 1936 (ND 1945-47) Pick 12b PCGS Very Choice New 64PPQ.
A gorgeous highest denomination example of this 5 pounds denomination, featuring King George VI. Excellent embossing and brilliant colors are seen on both sides. Highly desirable in uncirculated condition.
Starting Bid: \$500


28009 Bahamas Bahamas Government 10 Dollars 1965 Pick 22a PMG Gem Uncirculated 65 EPQ.
A low numbered example from the island nation's first decimal issue. Queen Elizabeth II on the face, and a colorful scene of flamingos on the back. We sold a Gem Uncirculated 66 EPQ for just over $\$ 2,200$ earlier this year.
Starting Bid: $\$ 750$


28010 Bahamas Central Bank 20 Dollars 1974 Pick 39b PMG Gem Uncirculated 65 EPQ.
Featuring the signature of William C. Allen, this note was issued in or around 1980, and was replaced by a completely redesigned type in 1984. This denomination has become challenging to find in any sort of collectible grade, as its short life span and high face value prevented most from being saved for posterity. This example displays pack fresh original qualities, such a uncirculated paper, vivid colors, and clean, wide margins. At the time of cataloging, the PMG Population Report has graded only 14 examples in Uncirculated grades, which is surprisingly low for a 1980s issued banknote.

28011 Bahamas Central Bank 50 Dollars 1974 Pick 40b PMG Very Fine 25 Net.
A decent example of a key variety, bearing the Allen signature, for Bahamas. Queen Elizabeth II on the face, and a market scene on the back. Rare in any grade. Rust, erasure.
Starting Bid: \$500


28012 Bahamas Central Bank 50 Dollars 1974 (ND 1992) Pick 55 PMG Gem Uncirculated 66 EPQ $\star$.
Queen Elizabeth II is seen on the face, and the Bank's headquarters in Nassau on the back. There were only three prefixes issued for this higher denomination, of which C was the first. We offered this exact note back in 2017, and it realized just over $\$ 1,900$. This variety has become a modern rarity, and is very sought after in this top grade.
Starting Bid: \$900


28013 Bahamas Central Bank 100 Dollars 1974 (ND 1992) Pick 56 PMG About Uncirculated 55 EPQ.
Only the lightest circulation is seen on this highest denomination from the 1992 issue. Queen Elizabeth II on the face, and a blue marlin on the back. Always popular, and missing from most decent collections.

28014 Bahamas Central Bank 50 Dollars 1996 Pick 61 PMG Superb Gem Unc 68 EPQ.
A short lived issue which included the last $\$ 50$ to have Queen Elizabeth II on its face. This issue is different from the previous issue mainly in updated security features, an updated portrait of the monarch, and it displays an ascending horizontal serial number. This example is tied for top graded on the PMG census with only one other. The last offering we made in the same grade sold for $\$ 2,400$ in 2017.

28015 Barbados Government of Barbados 2 Dollars 1.12.1939 Pick 3b PMG Very Fine 20.
Interestingly, the $\$ 1$ denomination is relatively easy to locate, but any denomination higher has become quite rare. In fact, this is the first \$2 we have offered. A widely sought after King George VI type that seldom appears at any time, in any grade. At the time of cataloging, there are only five Pick 3b notes graded in the PMG Population Report.

28016 Barbados Government of Barbados 2 Dollars ND (1938-49) Pick 3s Specimen PMG Choice Very Fine 35 Net.
A beautiful and rare denomination, more difficult to obtain than 1 and 5 Dollars of the same series. This Specimen sheds light into the prefix scheme for this series, which indicates how few of these issued notes were actually issued. Printer annotations and perforated cancellation are seen on this otherwise crisp and handsome example. Mount remnants are noted on the right side.

28017 Belgian Congo Banque du Congo Belge, Elisabethville 5 Francs 2.12.1924 Pick 8a PMG About Uncirculated 53.

An elusive small change example issued at Elisabethville. Country view on the face, and a steamship on the back. This is the top graded example on the PMG Population Report by far, and rare as such.

28018 Belgian Congo Banque du Congo Belge, Leopoldville 5 Francs 3.12.1924 Pick 8bs Specimen PMG About Uncirculated 55 EPQ.

An interesting and very rare Specimen, created for the Leopoldville, the capital city of the Belgian Congo. Seldom seen in this form, and the first we have offered. Completely original paper is seldom seen for this series. A red overprint is seen on each side, as well as solid zero serial numbers. The first we have offered and currently the lone example in the PMG Population Report.

Extremely Rare 500 Francs Specimen


28019 Belgium Banque National de Belgique 500 Francs 1944-45 Pick 127as Specimen PMG About Uncirculated 50.
This extremely rare and assuredly underappreciated Specimen has flown under the radar for quite some time. This is the only example graded in the PMG Population Report at the time of cataloging. Additionally, completed sales records for a Specimen of this denomination do not exist, which should indicate the rarity of this type. Some issues to the right edge, such as mount remnants and trimming are mentioned for accuracy. A red overprint is seen on each side. Highly unusual and worthy of strong consideration.

## Seldom Seen Highest Denomination King George VI Issue



28020 Bermuda Bermuda Government 5 Pounds 17.2.1947 Pick 17 PMG Choice Very Fine 35.
A superb offering, seldom seen in any grade. This is the highest denomination of the series, and was unpopular locally for many years. The first orange colored 5 Pounds were delivered in Bermuda in 1943, and, this example began circulating in September, 1947. Only 350,000 notes were issued with this date. The prefix scheme increases incrementally, which was a security measure to prevent counterfeiters from understanding the serial number and prefix relationship. Extant examples in issued form are seldom seen in any grade. An iconic King George VI banknote which is missing from many of the best collections of British Commonwealth notes.

28021 Bermuda Bermuda Government 5 Pounds 17.2.1947 Pick 17 PMG Very Fine 25.
A pleasing highest denomination featuring Hamilton harbor and King George VI on the face, and the Royal crest on the back. Scarce in any grade.
Starting Bid: \$1,000

## Highest Denomination Queen Elizabeth II Type in Superb Gem



28022 Bermuda Bermuda Government 10 Pounds 28.7.1964 Pick 22 PMG Superb Gem Unc 67 EPQ.
Colorful, beautifully designed, and seldom seen today; this highest denomination type is widely sought after, especially in such an impressive state of preservation. At the time of cataloging, only one example grades finer in the PMG Population Report. This denomination was initially conceived due to inflation and the depreciation of the Pound against the U.S. Dollar. Bradbury, Wilkinson \& Company prepared 300,000 banknotes, but release was slightly delayed due to a technical issue with the security strip. Finally issued in November of 1964, this denomination was initially unpopular, but gained usefulness when the pound was devalued in 1967. However, in 1969, Bermuda announced the change from Pounds to Dollars in decimalized form, which would void the older banknotes. Serial numbers 000,001 to 250,000 were issued, with the final 50,000 supposedly destroyed. This example, with utterly impressive pack fresh original quality, bears a serial number from the supposedly unissued stock. A forward thinking person with access to banknotes in Hamilton must have saved this beautiful example as a souvenir, and thankfully so. An important Queen Elizabeth II offering and desirable in this lofty grade.

## The Harry M. Eisenhauer Collection



Some of the most remarkable collections are built by the collectors and researchers that give back to the hobby most. Harry M. Eisenhauer is no exception. Harry specialized in Canadian Chartered Banknotes, with a particular focus on the Eastern Provinces of Canada. Over 50 years of collecting, he was able to acquire some of the most spectacular rarities from Nova Scotia, New Brusnwick, Quebec, and Prince Edward Island. The Bank of Canada notes offered here today are among the finest known, many from the first ten notes issues of their respective type.

Harry started collecting at the age of nine in 1947. He was drawn to the engravings on stamps, naturally leading to an interest in Canadian banknotes. He ardently shared his passion with others, serving fellow collectors and advancing the hobby through his activities in numismatics. He is Life Member No. 16 of the Canadian Paper Money Society, and served as the first Vice President and Membership Director, later serving as President. He also served as President and a founding member in the Atlantic Provinces Numismatic Association and Fredericton Numismatic Society. Beyond numismatics, Harry is a founding patron of the J. Douglas Ferguson Education and Research Foundation, and Farmers Bank of Rustico Museum.

Education was important to Harry, as he served as a frequent speaker, convention chairman and moderator of many an educational symposium at local, regional, and national events. Harry lent a hand to Bob Graham, contributing significantly to the Canadian Paper Money Society Note Registry for more than 30 years. His notes were listed, and are undoubtedly on want lists for many a specialists, waiting for this offering today. Harry also served as a contributor to the Charlton catalogs, both for research and market pricing. His lifelong endeavors have earned him honorary life memberships in The Halifax Regional Coin Club, Ingersoll Coin Club, and Prince Edward Island Numismatic Association. In 1973, he was awarded the Dale Garland Award.

Harry helped shape Canadian banknote collecting, and we owe him a great debt of gratitude. Today's offering is the first time that many collectors will have a chance to compete for Chartered banknote rarities, and the conditions of the representative survivors are in many cases, unequaled.

Highest Known Denomination from First Philippine Republic

The Spanish-American War had repercussions on multiple continents which affected millions of people, and ultimately shifted the balance of power in Southeast Asia. After centuries of oppressive rule, the Spanish stranglehold on the Philippines began showing its weakness, and the Filipino people took advantage of the situation to declare independence from colonial powers. Emilio Aguinaldo lead the charge and was instituted as the first President of the Republic. Neither Spain nor the United States recognized the Republic. However, the new government in Manila issued a series of banknotes which circulated briefly and extant examples are seldom seen today. After the Spanish American War concluded, the new Philippine Republic declared war on the United States, and a three year war began. Aguinaldo and his forces surrendered to the United States in 1902, and a new series of coins and banknotes were issued the following year. This crudely made banknote is extremely rare as a fully issued banknote, complete with a serial number and a manuscript signature of Pedro A. Paterno. Ink stains and smudges are seen on this otherwise Uncirculated type. The 1 Peso is seen on occasion, but this 5 Pesos denomination is the true rarity. In fact, this is the first example with serial numbers and a signature offered in public auction. Assuredly missing from even the most advanced collections and eminently desirable. A historically important 19th century type issued by the brief Republican government created in a desperate attempt for self determination. Iconic and extremely rare, as these notes circulated from 1898 until 1903.

## Superb First "Philippine Republic" Banknote

In most cases, banknotes are desirable due to their aesthetic features, high denomination, or rarity. This example from the Philippines is exceedingly rare and is an important relic from the first Republic on the entire Asian continent. The Spanish-American War began in 1898, and had a lasting impact on global balance of power, as the United States obtained its first true colonial possessions and ended Spanish involvement in the Caribbean and Southeast Asia. Immediately thereafter, Philippine forces attacked their new colonial leaders and established the first Philippine Republic lead by Emilio Aguinaldo. The United States regained control of the archipelago by 1901 and the republic ended. In that brief period of the Republic, two hasty series of banknotes were created, all with common design elements. This example is the only known surviving denomination of the 1899 series, and it truly is remarkable to encounter one in Uncirculated grade. Hastily applied serial numbers are seen on the front side of this banknote. A light paper scuff prevents a higher grade for this seldom-seen banknote from this historically pivotal time in Philippines history. ## Russian-American Co. 25 Kopeks Ex: Clifford




28379 Russia Russian-American Company 25 Kopeks ND (1816-1867) Pick UNL Kardakoff 53.2 PMG Choice Uncirculated 63.
After nearly four decades since the offering of the Henry Clifford Collection, two significant notes of American Territorial significance are being offered here today.

Chartered by Czar Paul I in 1799, the Russian-American Company had a monopoly on trade in Russian America. The territory included the Aleutian Islands, Alaska, and extended as far south as present-day Northern California. Fort Ross, located in Sonoma County, CA was established by the RussianAmerican Company (RAC) in 1812. The state-sponsored trading company also had Fort Elizabeth built on the island of Kauai, Hawaii in an attempt to gain influence there as well. The RAC was similar in scope to the Hudson's Bay Company and the East India Companies. In all, the Russian-American Company was established with the sale of 724 shares at 1,000 rubles each, for a total of 724,000 rubles.

To facilitate trade in each of the company's theaters of operations, notes were produced by the Russian-American Company and issued circa 1816 to 1867. Seven different denominations have been reported: 10, 25, and 50 Kopeks along with $1,5,10$, and 25 Rubles.

One of the primary businesses of the Russian-American Company was fur trading. The notes are often referred to as "walrus or sealskin money" because some of the notes were actually printed on walrus skins or other skins, including this example. Otter skins were shipped in waterproof walrus skin bags and the bags were then recycled to produce the notes. In Russia the notes were known as Kozhanye (skins). Contemporary accounts show the notes circulated in nearly every locale the company operated, from Russia to Alaska, and into California.

In 1867, U.S. Secretary of State William H. Seward negotiated the sale of Alaska to the United States for $\$ 7$ million dollars and the RAC ceased operations. The purchase was known as "Seward's Folly" until gold was discovered.

The Alaskan Parchment Scrip of the Russian American Company 1816-1867, Randolph Zander's 1996 48-page monograph, is the most comprehensive reference on the subject. Zander expanded upon Ted Uhl's earlier research. In the monograph, Zander explains that beginning circa 1842, changes to the physical appearance of certain notes were performed by hand and were made as a means of differentiating the various denominations, as much of the native population was illiterate. The upper corners of the 10 kopek notes were holed, all four corners of the 25 kopek pieces were clipped, and the 50 kopek examples were clipped at the upper two corners.

An estimated 150-200 total pieces of Russian-American Company scrip are believed to survive today, with many of the survivors housed in museums around the world, including the Hermitage, the Museum of Anthropology and Ethnography in St. Petersburg, the Smithsonian, the National Museum in Helsinki, and the Ulster Museum in Belfast; leaving very few pieces available to private collectors.

While some examples of the Walrus Skin notes in high grade have passed through auction in recent decades, it is widely accepted that the largest offering of the highest graded examples was part of the Henry Clifford Collection in 1982. The two pieces here stood the test of time with incredible third-party grades of Choice Uncirculated 63, and Choice Uncirculated 64 EPQ . The 25 Kopeck example shows the four clipped corners, as issued, to designate the denomination. The serial number 17346 remains bold, with the skin in ideal condition. On back is the company seal, with the iconic two-headed eagle used by the Russian crown.

With so few offerings in high grade, and most survivors impounded in government institutions, the current offering will prove exciting for buyers specializing in Russian issues, or notes from the early United States and its territories.

Immaculate 50 Kopeks from The Russian-American Company

The second example of incredible Russian-American Company notes printed on Walrus skin parchment. The notes were part of a large trading company endeavor that stretched from Russia around the Pacific rim to Alaska and into California. Trading outposts in Hawaii were also maintained by the company, a significant presence in what became western territories of the United States.

This 50 Kopeks piece is a perfect pair to the 25 Kopeks note also offered here. The pieces were last offered nearly 40 years ago as part of the Henry Clifford Collection, which remains the largest ever offering of notes from this issuer. Research shows many of the limited number of survivors to be permanently impounded in institutional collections. With limited discoveries since Randolph Zander's 1996 article on the subject, we surmise the current pair are easily condition census notes, if note the finest known for their respective denominations. This note is as issued, with two clipped corners to denote the denomination. The skin is bright and original, with a strong penned 13358 serial number. On the face is Марка вь Америкь / 50 КОП, meaning "American Scrip / 50 Корeks" in current numismatic terms. On verso, the Russian-American Company insignia with the double-headed eagle of the Russian Crown at center.

Stunning vignettes of Springbucks grazing on the face, with a map of Africa on the back. The prefix N/1 denotes this example having been issued in Natal, and a very small serial is noticed. This type is marked as unlisted because the Krause catalog lists Pick S553a as issued in Transvaal.
There is no sales history available for this variety in issued form, and there are none other graded on the PMG census. It is the first time the cataloger has seen an issued note after three decades of collecting South Africa. ## A Coveted Zanzibar 10 Rupees

If one was to consider a top ten list of iconic African banknotes, it is impossible to imagine a list devoid of at least one representation of a famed Zanzibar example. In recent times, this coveted series has propelled itself into a class of its own, and is continually increasing in its popularity.

Colonial influence on the small island started in the 15th century. Portuguese explorers were the first to arrive, followed by the Omani's, and then the British in 1890. As a semi-autonomous protectorate, a need for a local currency arose. At the time, Zanzibar was the largest exporter of clove. The Zanzibar Rupee replaced the Zanzibar Ryal, and was first issued in 1908. Interestingly, the Zanzibar Rupee was 1:1 to the Indian Rupee, and was circulated until 1936. It was also this time that the East African Shilling became legal tender.
All denominations are uniface, an Arab dhow is noticed to the left, and a clove harvesting scene to right. Each scene is beautifully highlighted by Arabic arches that effortlessly adds to the broader tang of the design.
Restoration and ink is mentioned. It is the catalogers opinion that the stamps add to the historical content on the item, rather than diminish from its attractiveness. Likewise, the minor restorations protect the note to be enjoyed by future generations, as there only a finite number of extant examples in existence.

## Note: Half-increment bidding is available prior to the live auction session.

12. If Auctioneer calls for a full increment, Bidder may request Auctioneer to accept a Cut Bid only once per lot. After offering a Cut Bid, Bidder may continue to bid on lot only at full increments. Off-increment bids may be accepted by the Auctioneer at Signature ${ }^{\circ}$ Auctions. Bids solicited by Auctioneer at other than the expected increment will not be considered Cut Bids.

## Conducting the Auction:

13. Notice of the consignor's liberty to place bids on his lots in the Auction is hereby made in accordance with Article 2 of the Texas Business and Commercial Code. A "Minimum Bid" is an amount below which the lot will not sell. THE CONSIGNOR OF PROPERTY MAY PLACE WRITTEN "Minimum Bids" ON HIS LOTS IN ADVANCE OF THE AUCTION; ON SUCH LOTS, IF THE HAMMER PRICE DOES NOT MEET THE

14. The highest qualified Bidder recognized by the Auctioneer shall be the Buyer. In the event of a tie bid, the earliest bid received or recognized wins. In the event of any dispute between any Bidders at an Auction, Auctioneer may at his sole discretion reoffer the lot. Auctioneer's decision and declaration of the winning Bidder shall be final and binding upon all Bidders. Bids properly offered, whether by floor Bidder or other means of bidding, may on occasion be missed or go unrecognized; in such cases, the Auctioneer may declare the recognized bid accepted as the winning bid, regardless of whether a competing bid may have been higher. Auctioneer reserves the right after the hammer fall to accept bids and reopen bidding for bids placed through the Internet or otherwise. Regardless of placed bids, Auctioneer reserves the right to withdraw any lot, or any part of a lot, from Auction at any time prior to the opening of any such lot by the auctioneer (crier), or in the case of Internet-only auctions when the bid opens for either live Internet bidding or the beginning of any extended period.
15. Auctioneer reserves the right to refuse to honor any bid or to limit the amount of any bid, in its sole discretion. Any person apparently appearing on the OFAC list is not eligible to bid.
16. Nominal Bids. The Auctioneer in its sole discretion may reject nominal bids, small opening bids, or very nominal advances.
17. Lots bearing bidding estimates shall open at Auctioneer's discretion (generally $40 \%-60 \%$ of the low estimate). In the event that no bid meets or exceeds that opening amount, the lot shall pass as unsold or the Auctioneer may place a protective bid on behalf of the consignor.
18. All items are to be purchased per lot as numerically indicated and no lots will be broken.
19. Auctioneer reserves the right to rescind the sale in the event of nonpayment, breach of a warranty, disputed ownership, auctioneer's clerical error or omission in exercising bids and reserves, or for any other reason and in Auctioneer's sole discretion.
20. Auctioneer occasionally experiences Internet and/or Server service outages, and Auctioneer periodically schedules system downtime for maintenance and other purposes, during which Bidders cannot participate or place bids. Payment:
23. All sales are strictly for cash in United States dollars (including U.S. currency, bank wire, cashier checks, travelers checks, eChecks, and bank money orders, and are subject to all reporting requirements). All deliveries are subject to good funds; funds being received in Auctioneer's account before delivery of the merchandise; and all payments are subject to a clearing period. Auctioneer reserves the right to determine if a check constitutes "good funds": checks drawn on a U.S. bank are subject to a ten business day hold, thirty days when drawn on an international bank. Clients with pre-arranged credit may receive immediate credit for payments via eCheck, personal, or corporate checks. All others will be subject to a hold of 5 business days, or more, for the funds to clear prior to releasing merchandise. (Ref. T\&C item 7 Credit for additional information.) Payments can be made 24-48 hours post auction from the My Orders page of the HA.com website. Payment via credit card (Visa, Mastercard, Discover, and American Express) will be accepted upon prior approval by Auctioneer. All payments by credit card will incur a surcharge of $2.5 \%$. 25. Purchased lots may be subject to taxes or fees imposed by various foreign taxing agencies. Should state sales tax become applicable in the state for delivery prior to delivery of the property on the invoice, Buyer agrees to pay all applicable state sales tax as required by the delivery state as of the shipping date. Buyer agrees to pay Auctioneer the actual amount of tax due in the event that sales tax is not properly collected due to: 1) an expired, inaccurate, or inappropriate tax certificate or declaration, 2) an incorrect interpretation of the applicable statute, 3) or any other reason. The appropriate form or certificate must be on file at and verified by Auctioneer five days prior to Auction, or tax must be paid; only if such form or certificate is received by Auctioneer within 4 days after Auction can a refund of tax paid be made. Lots from different Auctions may not be aggregated for sales tax purposes.
26. In the event that Buyer's payment is dishonored upon presentment(s), Buyer shall pay the maximum statutory processing fee set by applicable state law. If Buyer attempts to pay via eCheck and Buyer's financial institution denies this bank account, or the payment cannot be completed using the selected funding source, Buyer agrees to complete payment using your credit card on file (subject to the surcharge detailed in paragraph 23).
27. If any Auction invoice submitted by Auctioneer is not paid in full when due, the unpaid balance will bear interest at the highest rate permitted by law from the date of invoice until paid. Any invoice not paid when due will bear a three percent ( $3 \%$ ) late fee on the invoice amount. If the Auctioneer refers any invoice to an attorney for collection, Buyer agrees to pay attorney's fees, court costs, and other collection costs incurred by Auctioneer. If Auctioneer assigns collection to its in-house legal staff, such attorney's time expended on the matter shall be compensated at a rate comparable to the hourly rate of independent attorneys.
28. In the event Buyer fails to pay any amounts due, Auctioneer reserves the right to sell the lot(s) securing the invoice to any underbidders in the Auction that the lot(s) appeared, or at subsequent private or public sale, or relist the $\operatorname{lot}(\mathrm{s})$ in a future auction conducted by Auctioneer. A defaulting Buyer agrees to pay for the reasonable costs of resale (including a $15 \%$ seller's commission, if consigned to an auction conducted by Auctioneer). The defaulting Buyer is liable to pay any difference between his total original invoice for the $\operatorname{lot}(\mathrm{s})$, plus any applicable interest, and the net proceeds for the lot(s) if sold at private sale or the subsequent hammer price of the lot(s) less the $15 \%$ seller's commissions, if sold at an Auctioneer's auction.
29. Title shall not pass to Buyer until all invoices are paid in full. Auctioneer shall have a lien against the merchandise purchased by Buyer to secure payment of any and all outstanding Auction invoices. Auctioneer is further granted a lien and the right to retain possession of any other property of Buyer then held by Auctioneer or its affiliates to secure payment of any Auction invoice or any other amounts due Auctioneer or affiliates from Buyer. With respect to these lien rights, Auctioneer shall have all the rights of a secured creditor under Article 9 of the Texas Uniform Commercial Code, including but not limited to the right of sale
(including a $15 \%$ seller's commission, if consigned to an auction conducted by Auctioneer). Any Heritage foreclosure auction venue, whether or not the same venue as when the debt was incurred (e.g. Signature, Internet, or weekly), is deemed a reasonably commercial sale. 30. Buyer is liable for all shipping, handling, registration, and renewal fees, if any. Please refer to Auctioneer's website HA.com/c/shipping.zx for the latest charges or call Auctioneer. Auctioneer is unable to combine purchases from other auctions or affiliates into one package for shipping purposes. Merchandise will be shipped in a commercially reasonable time after payment in good funds for the merchandise and the shipping fees is received or credit extended, except when third-party shipment occurs. Buyer on lots designated for third-party shipment must designate the common carrier, accept risk of loss, and prepay shipping costs. Buyer agrees that Service and Handling charges related to shipping items which are not pre-paid may be charged to the credit card on file with Auctioneer (subject to the surcharge detailed in paragraph 23).
31. Successful international Bidders shall provide written shipping instructions, including specified customs declarations, to Auctioneer for any lots to be delivered outside of the United States. NOTE: Declaration value shall be the item'(s) hammer price together with its buyer's premium and Auctioneer shall use the correct harmonized code for the lot.
32. On all shipments in which Auctioneer charges the Delivery, Handling, and Transit Fee infra, any risk of loss during shipment will be borne by Auctioneer until the common carrier's confirmation of delivery to the address of record in Auctioneer's file, this is the "Secure Location". A common carrier's confirmation is conclusive to prove delivery to Buyer; if the client has a Signature release on file with the carrier, the package is considered delivered without Signature. Auctioneer shall arrange, select, and engage common carriers and other transportation vendors on your behalf. Transit services are subject to the following terms and conditions:
a. Scope of Transit Services: Merchandise for transit will be insured under one or more insurance policies issued by an authorized broker to Auctioneer. The merchandise will be insured for the invoice price of the properties (hammer price plus Buyer's Premium) ("Insured Value"). For each shipment, Buyer will provide a Secure Location to which the items will be delivered. NOTICE: Auctioneer is neither an insurance company nor a common carrier of any type.

Auctioneer's Compensation for Transit Services: Auctioneer will provide transit services to Buyer for $3 / 4$ of $1 \%$ of the Insured Value, plus packaging and handling fees and fees for the common carrier (collectively, "Delivery, Handling, and Transit Fee"). Buyer agrees to pay Delivery, Handling, and Transit Fee and comply with all terms of payment as set forth herein.
c. Auctioneer's Limitation of Liability for Transit Services: Buyer understands and agrees that Auctioneer's liability for loss of or damage to the items, if any, ends when the items have been delivered to the Secure Location, and Auctioneer has received evidence of delivery. Any claim that property has sustained loss or damage during transit must be reported to Auctioneer within seventy-two (72) hours of the delivery date. Any recovery for loss of or damage to any merchandise is limited to the lesser of actual cash value of the merchandise or the Insured Value. Under no circumstances is Auctioneer liable for consequential or punitive damages.
33. It shall be the responsibility for Buyer to arrange pick-up or shipping in a timely manner (within 10 days) Merchandise will be subject to storage and moving charges, including a $\$ 100$ administration fee plus $\$ 10$ daily storage for larger items and $\$ 5$ daily for smaller items (storage fee per item) after 35 days. In the event the merchandise is not removed within ninety days, the merchandise may be offered for sale to recover any past due storage or moving fees, including a $20 \%$ Seller's Commission.
34. A. NOTICE OF CITES COMPLIANCE: The purchase of items made from protected species: Any property made of or incorporating endangered or protected species or wildlife may have import and/or expor restrictions established by the Convention of International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora (CITES) in various countries and domestically. Plant and animal properties include (but are not limited to) items made of (or including) Brazilian rosewood, ivory, whalebone, turtle shell, coral, crocodile, alligator, lizard, or other wildlife. These items may not be available to ship internationally or, in some cases, domestically. 37. Any request for shipping verification for undelivered packages must be made within 30 days of shipment by Auctioneer.

38. NO WARRANTY, WHETHER EXPRESSED OR IMPLIED, IS MADE WITH RESPECT TO ANY DESCRIPTION CONTAINED IN THIS AUCTION OR ANY SECOND OPINE. Any description of merchandise or second opine contained in this Auction is for the sole purpose of identifying merchandise for those Bidders who do not have the opportunity to view merchandise prior to bidding, and no description of merchandise has been made part of the basis of the bargain or has created any express warranty that merchandise would conform to any description made by Auctioneer. Color variations can be expected in any electronic or printed imaging, and are not grounds for the return of any lot. NOTE: Auctioneer, in specified auction venues, e.g. Fine Art, may have express written warranties and Bidder is referred to those specific terms and conditions.
39. Auctioneer is selling only such right or title to merchandise being sold as Auctioneer may have by virtue of consignment agreements on the date of auction and disclaims any warranty of title to the merchandise. Auctioneer disclaims any warranty of merchantability or fitness for any particular purposes. 40. Translations of foreign language documents may be provided as a convenience to interested parties. Auctioneer makes no representation as to the accuracy of those translations and will not be held responsible for errors in bidding arising from inaccuracies in translation.
41. Auctioneer disclaims all liability for damages, consequential or otherwise, arising out of or in connection with the sale of any merchandise by Auctioneer to Bidder. No third party may rely on any benefit of these Terms and Conditions and any rights, if any, established hereunder are personal to Bidder and may not be assigned. Any statement made by the Auctioneer is an opinion and does not constitute a warranty or representation No employee of Auctioneer may alter these Terms and Conditions, and, unless signed by a principal of Auctioneer, any such alteration is null and void.
42. Auctioneer shall not be liable for breakage of glass or damage to frames (patent or latent); such defects, in any event, shall not be a basis for return or reduction in purchase price.

Release
41. In consideration of participation in Auction and the placing of a bid, Bidder expressly releases Auctioneer, its officers, directors and employees, its affiliates, and its outside experts that provide second opines, from any and all claims, cause of action, chose of action, whether at law or equity or any arbitration or mediation rights existing under the rules of any professional society or affiliation based upon the assigned description, or a derivative theory, breach of warranty express or implied, representation or other matter set forth within these Terms and Conditions of Auction or otherwise. In the event of a claim, Bidder agrees that such rights and privileges conferred therein are strictly construed as specifically declared herein, and are the exclusive remedy. Bidder, by non-compliance to these express terms of a granted remedy, shall waive any claim against Auctioneer.
42. Notice: Some merchandise sold by Auctioneer is inherently dangerous e.g. firearms, cannons, and small items that may be swallowed or ingested or may have latent defects all of which may cause harm to a person. Buyer accepts all risk of loss or damage from its purchase of these items and Auctioneer disclaims any liability whether under contract or tort for damages and losses, direct or inconsequential, and expressly disclaims any warranty as to safety or usage of any lot sold.

## Dispute Resolution, Arbitration, and Remedies:

By placing a bid or otherwise participating in Auction, Bidder accepts these Terms and Conditions of Auction, and specifically agrees to the dispute resolution provided herein.
43. Exclusive Dispute Resolution Process: All claims, disputes, or controversies in connection with, relating to, and/or arising out of Bidder's participation in Auction or purchase of any lot, any interpretation of the Terms and Conditions of Sale or any amendments thereto, any description of any lot or condition report, any damage to any lot, any alleged verbal modification of any term of sale or condition report or description, and/or any purported settlement whether asserted in contract, tort, under Federal or State statute or regulation, or any claim made by Bidder of a lot or Bidder's participation in Auction involving the auction or a specific lot involving a warranty or representation of a consignor or other person or entity including Auctioneer \{which claim Bidder consents to be made a party\} (collectively, "Claim") shall be exclusively heard by, and the claimant (or respondent) and Auctioneer each consent to the Claim being presented in a confidential binding arbitration before a single arbitrator administrated by and conducted under the rules of, the American Arbitration Association. The locale for all such arbitrations shall be Dallas, Texas. The arbitrator's award may be enforced in any court of competent jurisdiction. In the event that any Claim needs to be litigated, including actions to compel arbitration, construe the agreement, actions in aid of arbitration, or otherwise, such litigation shall be exclusively in the Courts of the State of Texas, in Dallas County, Texas, and if necessary the corresponding appellate courts. If a Claim involves a consumer, exclusive subject matter jurisdiction for the Claim is in the State District Courts of Dallas County, Texas and the consumer consents to subject matter and in personam jurisdiction; further CONSUMER EXPRESSLY WAIVES ANY RIGHT TO TRIAL BY JURY. A consumer may elect arbitration as specified above. Any claim involving the purchase or sale of numismatic or related items may be submitted through binding PNG arbitration. A Claim is not subject to class certification.
44. Choice of Law: Agreement and any Claim shall be determined and construed under Texas law.
45. Fees and Costs: The prevailing party (a party that is awarded substantial and material relief on its damage claim based on damages sought versus awarded or the successful defense of a Claim based on damages sought versus awarded) may be awarded reasonable attorneys' fees and costs.
46. Remedies: Any Claim must be brought within two (2) years of the alleged breach, default or misrepresentation or the Claim is waived. After one (1) year has elapsed, Auctioneer's maximum liability shall be limited to any commissions and fees Auctioneer earned on that lot. Auctioneer in no event shall be responsible for consequential damages, incidental damages, compensatory damages, or any other damages arising or claimed to be arising from the auction of any lot. Exemplary or punitive damages are not permitted and are waived. In the event that Auctioneer cannot deliver the lot or subsequently it is established that the lot lacks title, or other transfer or condition issue is claimed, in such cases the sole remedy shall be limited to rescission of sale and refund of the amount paid by Buyer; in no case shall Auctioneer's maximum liability exceed the high bid on that lot, which bid shall be deemed for all purposes the value of the lot. In the event of an attribution error, Auctioneer may at its sole discretion, correct the error on the Internet, or, if discovered at a later date, refund Buyer's purchase price without further obligation.
